# Lutheran Church of the Cross Vision and Priorities at the Crossroads 2023-2025

As inclusive Christians living at the crossroads of faith and service on the unceded territory of the ləkwəŋən peoples, Lutheran Church of the Cross aspires to be a spiritual community committed to the liberating message of Jesus Christ for all peoples by:

## **Valuing Spiritual Growth Through:**

- 1. Inspiring, creative worship
  - Try innovative and new forms of worship as well as traditional worship resources
  - Ongoing support for in person and livestream worship
  - Upgrade in-church and livestream video, audio and hearing device equipment
  - Intentional engagement opportunities before worship
  - Orient members to assist in various capacities at worship
  - Welcome ideas from the congregation regarding worship
  - Look at posting sermons in other languages besides English

# 2. Personal spiritual practices

- Provide resources for renewal and healing from the pandemic's impact
- Tuesday morning prayer
- Special bible and spiritual nurturing groups
- Ensure the Memorial Gardens remain a comforting place for spiritual reflection
- Host guest speakers on spiritual topics
- Support praying friends across all generations
- Create a small sacred space in the sanctuary that can be used by anyone outside of worship

## 3. Learning opportunities for all ages

- Make use of "dessert and dialogue" formats for a variety of issues
- Advent and Lent special projects
- Provide opportunities to learn or practice languages other than English

#### 4. Celebrating Indigenous, Queer and Racialized communities

- Include social justice issues in planning worship and small group learning times
- Intentional and continuous renewal of the Reconciling in Christ commitment

## Honouring Each Other In Every Stage of Life Through:

- 1 Care of elders and homebound friends
  - Train members on visitation of one another
  - Support pastoral and congregational care of seniors

#### 2 Nurturing youth, solo people and families in their many forms

- Find creative ways to engage children and youth in the life of the community
- Update the Church of the Cross website

- Provide opportunities for all ages to meet each other as we build community
- Outreach to families with children to find out how to include and support them
- Offering free childcare to parents who they would like to attend meetings or be hospitality hosts
- 3 Compassionate support in an ever-changing world
  - Regular updates to the congregation from council, boards and committees
  - Responding to the changing needs of the congregation
  - Engaging with and supporting our pastors in their evolving roles and ministries
  - Understand and respond to the diverse needs of everyone at Church of the Cross
  - Promote small groups at Church of the Cross
  - Activities of the Women in Faith (stitch & chat, book club, random acts of kindness)
  - Supporting the "beyond grief" ministry to those experiencing personal grief
- 4 Affirming gifts of gender diversity

## **Practicing Inclusivity Through:**

- 1. Putting our theology into practice for social justice and Truth and Reconciliation
  - Learn about the challenges faced by marginalized groups
  - Respond to the worship, spiritual and social needs of differently abled peoples
  - Engage in learning about and responding to social justice issues such as reconciliation with First Nations, racism, gender diversity, poverty, homelessness, addiction and mental health
  - Welcoming and supporting refugees
  - Ongoing support for Harrison Place, Victoria Women's Transition House Society, Our Place and Anawim House
  - Activities of the Women in Faith (social gatherings for various and all ages)
  - Consider the needs of seniors and the challenge of ageism when thinking about isolated and marginalized people
- 2. Orienting newcomers to Church of the Cross
  - Informing newcomers of activities and inviting them to join
  - Welcome newcomers at worship and other events
  - Update the church directory with photos both in paper and online formats
  - Offer an annual community dinner in the fall
- 3. Engagement in Campus Ministry
  - Inform the congregation of activities and opportunities to involve students
  - Support the involvement of Luther House residents at LCC
  - Ensure sufficient funding for campus ministry
  - Support and participate in events with Inclusive Christians at University of Victoria
- 4. Action on food security together with Shelbourne Community Kitchen
  - Continued support of the Kitchen
  - Engaging wherever possible staff and people who access the Kitchen

## **Sharing Our Resources Through:**

- 1. Contributing our finances, time and abilities
  - Keep congregation informed of our financial needs
  - Invite members with all kinds of attributes to be involved in specific activities
  - Engage all ages in caring for the building and grounds of the church
  - Mentoring each other's skills for maintenance activities
  - Enlist members and friends to be hospitality hosts after worship and at other events
  - Communicating using multiple media tools to make it easier to stay informed
  - Activities of the Women in Faith (fundraising, trunk sale)
  - Support for Karren Stinson Bursary
- 2. Engaging in work with other denominations and faiths
  - Continuing the council-level connection with St Luke Anglican
  - Joint worship and other events with St Luke Anglican and other ecumenical partners
  - Joint Refugee sponsorship with Congregation Emanu-El
- 3. Making our facility available for use by the greater community
  - Ongoing maintenance of the building and property for safe usage by the congregation and renters
  - Consider converting the Upper Hall servery into a full kitchen
  - Offering subsidized housing to students at Luther House
  - Collaborating with Shelbourne Community Kitchen to offer a weekly drop-in for its participants
- 4. Caring for creation and the environment
  - Upgrade and maintain our facility to reduce our environmental footprint
  - Participate in events to learn how to live in harmony with Creation
  - Stay informed on actions to prevent harm to the environment and end the climate crisis
- 5. Collaborating with Luther Court on an intergenerational housing development
  - Keep congregation informed on developments related to the expansion of Luther Court
  - Cooperate with Luther Court when our maintenance projects coincide with their efforts and needs
  - Consider sale of Luther House and adjacent property to Luther Court and if approved, engage congregation on the best use of the proceeds.
