Welcome to the Cathedral Church of the Anglican Diocese of British Columbia. Here we respectfully acknowledge that we gather to worship on the ancestral lands of the Esquimalt and Songhees Nations, with whom we are in relationship to seek reconciliation.

As an Anglican centre for spirituality, learning, culture, heritage and community, this cathedral upholds a daily rhythm of worship in the heart of Victoria. From daily spoken and sung services to the weekly celebration of the Eucharist and Choral Evensong, we mark the important events of the Christian calendar and in the life of our diocese and the wider community.

About this service

This afternoon's service is special for several reasons: We mark the feast day of the patron saint of music, St Cecilia, with the coming together of many of Christ Church Cathedral's musical forces. It is also a kind of "homecoming" service for our choir alumni. In addition, this year in particular, we are pleased to be dedicating a new set of nave choir stalls built by local craftsman, Andrew Chilton. Of these twelve choir stalls, seven were underwritten by private donors and bear the following inscriptions:

- This stall is given in thanksgiving for the music ministry of Ian Alexander and Marilyn Dalzell and in celebration of Ian's seventy-fifth birthday, February 13, 2025.
- 2025: Giving thanks for the Cathedral Choir, where four generations of Groos family members have sung for a century.
- In grateful memory of Joan Terry Thackray (1930-1996) who nurtured the love of music in children.
- In memory of the Tyrwhitt-Drake family who served this Cathedral in various capacities including the choir from 1859-2025.
- In loving memory of David and Mary Barlow, who dedicated their lives in service to Christ Church Cathedral.
- Given to honour the leadership of Brian Groos, whose commitment gave service to the advancement of Sacred Music in its highest forms in this Cathedral.
- In memory of Bruce Kirkpatrick Hill (1963-2012).
