## From Pastor Denise

Happy New Year! New church year that is. The new church year, began on November 30 – the First Sunday of Advent. For my article this month I am going to walk us through the church year and its meaning for us as we worship together and journey through Jesus' life over the

course of 12 months.

Right now we are in the opening season of ADVENT. 'Advent' means 'coming.' It's not a word we use very often in daily speech anymore. It is a 4-week season before Christmas when we anticipate and prepare for Jesus' second coming and also remember his birth. During this season we hear the stories from the gospels about John the Baptist's birth and ministry at the Jordan river. We hear about Mary's visitation by the angel and her song of praise. We use the color blue for the paraments (the cloth that adorns the pulpit). Blue is a symbol of hope and anticipation. We light 4 candles representing hope, peace, joy and love.

Advent, of course, moves into the season of CHRISTMAS which is 12 days – the 12 days of Christmas – beginning Christmas Day and going until January 6, which is Epiphany. In the Christmas season we use the color white or gold to symbolize the light of Christ. Historically, white also has symbolized purity, but honestly we need to get away from associating the color white with purity and the racial implications of that connection. Gold might be the better color for all things Jesus. I say 'all things Jesus because any Sunday or season that has to do with Jesus' life is usually white or gold. Another thing that happens on these Jesus Sundays is that the Christ or Paschal candle is lit. That is the large white candle by the pulpit. We also light this candle for baptisms and funerals as we recognize that these are times in our lives where the Holy Trinity is particularly present and active.

The DAY OF EPIPHANY (Jan. 6) and/or Epiphany Sunday is also white or gold. Traditionally this is the day the magi visited Jesus in the house in Bethlehem (see Matthew 2). The word 'epiphany' means to reveal or to realize – "Oh, I had an epiphany." The SEASON OF EPIPHANY goes from Jan. 6 until Ash Wednesday. The color for the season is green – a color for growth and life. During the Epiphany season we hear stories that reveal to us who Jesus is and who we are as his followers. JESUS' BAPTISM falls within this season.

ASH WEDNESDAY is the beginning of the season of LENT. A day when we remember our mortality and enter a time of spiritual renewal and growth. The color for Ash Wednesday and Lent is purple, symbolizing a more somber journey into penitence and prayer as we walk with Jesus to the cross. Purple was also a color for royalty, in Jesus' day, and brings to mind the mocking of the Roman Soldiers as they placed a purple robe on him and called him "The King of the Jews." Lent is 6 weeks and culminates on PALM OR PASSION SUNDAY.

Palm/Passion Sunday begins HOLY WEEK, when we remember the events in the last week of Jesus' life. His entry into Jerusalem, his turning of the tables in the temple, the unnamed woman who anoints his feet, his last Passover supper with his disciples, his agonizing prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane, his arrest, trial and crucifixion. The colors for this week are purple and black.

Then after THE 3 DAYS (MAUNDY THURSDAY, GOOD FRIDAY AND HOLY SATURDAY) we enter into the EASTER Season. 50 days during which we rejoice and celebrate Jesus' resurrection and the salvific work God did for us in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. The color is white or gold and we light the Christ

Candle every Sunday during this season. It is also a traditional time for baptisms as we die and rise with Christ through the waters of baptism.

50 days after the Resurrection of our Lord is the DAY OF PENTECOST. On this day we celebrate the pouring out of the Holy Spirit upon Jesus' disciples. A great day to celebrate Affirmation of Baptism or Confirmation because in our baptism the Holy Spirit was poured out upon us. The color is red, symbolizing the flames of fire that descended on the heads of the disciples as they received the Holy Spirit.

The SEASON OF PENTECOST is the longest season of the church year. It is also called Ordinary Time. The color is green – again for growth and life. Within this season we also celebrate REFORMATION SUNDAY, ALL SAINTS SUNDAY and CHRIST THE KING or THE REIGN OF CHRIST SUNDAY. CHRIST THE KING SUNDAY is the final Sunday of the church year. A day during which we acknowledge Christ's reign in our lives. We often rehear the story of Jesus' crucifixion on this Sunday. This reminds us that we have a king willing to go to the cross for us. Not a king in a castle with a crown seeking power, but a king who died and rose for us.

And so this is our Church Year. We journey with Jesus from his birth, through his life and ministry, to his arrest, trial, crucifixion and resurrection, culminating in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon all those who claim Jesus as Lord of their life.

The Church Year is a journey that I have cherished over the course of my life and ministry. It is a cycle that reminds me of who I am as a Child of God and of who we are as the Body of Christ. We take this journey together as we lift one another up in faith. And the cycle never gets old because as we journey through life we always hear the stories of scripture in new ways and in new circumstances. Thank you for taking this journey with me and for the privilege of walking with you as we journey together.





## Highlights from the November 2025 Council Meeting

- The council began with Dwelling in the Word for devotions.
- All reports were approved.
- There was discussion around the concern in the Caring Team report about serving the Guest House breakfasts twice a year and the need for a few more volunteers to make that happen. We will ask for those interested in serving future breakfasts to sign up on the yellow sheet in order to get a core list of volunteers and then go from there.
- There was a motion to consolidate 3 of the reserve accounts into other reserve accounts that serve the same purpose. The motion was approved. David will do that consolidation in the books.
- There was continued discussion on beginning the process to become a Reconciling in Christ congregation and how to introduce that to the congregation.
- Plans were made for introducing the Prayer Ground idea to the congregation through Tidings articles, Renderings, Mission Moments, and feedback sessions.
- There was discussion about ways to help more people get involved in using RaiseRight as it has become a good source of income. Tammy and Jason Woodbury will be available to help people get signed up and understand how to use it.
- There was discussion about the need to recruit more Sunday School teachers and helpers now that
  the pre-school class is growing. We especially need teachers and helpers when one of the teachers
  is gone. The classes are getting too big to combine. There are also some misconceptions out there
  that helping with Sunday School requires a lot of prep or training in storytelling. This is not the case.
  We will talk with Alyssa and look at ways to introduce how Sunday School works to the
  congregation and invite people to consider helping.

## Financial Update for October

We took another step back with our monthly net income in October, therefore almost doubling our deficit.

- 1. Net income was -\$4,097; Year-To-Date net income is now increased to -\$9,267.
- 2. We did have \$350 given for Utilities, which was our special request last month due to the higher anticipated costs.
- 3. Compared to last year at this time, we are \$8,000 down in operating income, and up \$5,000 in expenses.

We want to thank Trinity for the financial support you provide to continue our ministries. As a reminder, we have only two more months to try and eliminate our deficit by year end as projected in our budget. We do need your help, and any additional gifting support that you could provide would be greatly appreciated.


