You are here to change this place and us. We are not afraid.



In deep blue darkness, lighting a single candle creates only uncertainty.


Light dances around uncertain shapes, and the dark refuses to yield its secrets.


This first candle on our Advent wreath represents our first flickering glimpse of the goodness God has hidden in divine darkness.

Peace be within your walls and quietness within your towers.






