



# Womens Group:


Our next meeting will be **Sunday Dec 7**th **at noon**. We'll enjoy some Christmas festiveness and enjoy chatting about our lives and God in our lives. Please join!



- Our collaboration with Zion Lutheran Church in Gasport continues. I share ½ of my full-time pastoral call with Zion. I lead worship with Zion on the first Sunday of each month and then coordinate worship leaders to be there on other Sundays; in addition to meetings, administrative duties, pastoral care needs and any pastoral acts. We also collaborate on some faith formation activities, notably Bible Study on Thursday mornings at 10 am. This Bible Study rotates among five churches, which has been working well. Zion needed a transition pastor upon the retirement of their pastor after 43 years of ministry, and Trinity needs the financial boost that ¼ of a pastor's pay package being reimbursed offers. Officially this collaboration continues through the end of the year, but longer-term options are being investigated. Keep Zion in prayer as they continue through their time of transition.
- I have a **pastoral care list** of around 10 people that I care for through a combination of phone calls and visits to homes, hospitals and other care facilities. Please reach out if you are interested in a visit or phone call or have ideas about how to help care for our siblings in this sacred way.
- With our Sunday School growing, it means our weekly offering counters are now short a **counter**. Please reach out to Becky Fix if you might be able to help with this important work.
- Pastor will be off from Dec 25<sup>th</sup>-Jan 2<sup>nd</sup>, but is on call for any pastoral care emergencies.



- Our property committee is now without coordinators, so we've started calling on people with certain property-related skills to help.
- If you have talents you can share to help on any church project, please let us know.



- All parents are asked to join Pastor during Sunday School for a brief meeting on December 14<sup>th</sup>.
  - Pastor would like to talk about what lies ahead with the confirmation aged class, as well as youth ministry and LCLC camping opportunities.
  - o For anyone who has not received their first Bible from church, we'll share details about the process.
