The Christmas Consequence: A Change for Good

A few years ago, the ELCA provided a marketing campaign for congregations: "In (your town) for Good." Being a fan of double entendre (especially as used in the Gospel of John), this English major thought that this was a pretty crafty idea. "For Good" implies both that a congregation exists in its context "for the betterment" as well as "forever." Pretty clever and creative!

So, fast forward to our current time and the recent release of the movie, "Wicked: For Good." It's the follow up to last year's simply titled, "Wicked"—both together being an onscreen version of a Broadway musical that debuted in 2003 and based on a book that came out in 1995 (so spoiler alert: the story is 30 years old; the music 22 years old—yeah, you really couldn't count anything said here as a "spoiler"). My wife and I saw the stage version in 2017 in London. And though I vaguely remember an emotional resonance with the song that gives this year's part 2 its name, the lyrics have a much greater meaning in light of where life's journey has led me.

The story centers around two characters made famous in "The Wizard of Oz:" Glinda (the good witch) and Elphaba (the wicked witch of the west) whose friendship is examined through the years: revealing that what appears to be "good" on the surface may actually be bad, while the exact opposite may also be true with that which appears to be "bad" or "wicked" on the surface may actually be good. So as any good Lutheran would pick up, Luther's theme of being "Saint and Sinner At the Same Time" is quite evident as the concepts of Good and Evil (and even the well known plot points of 1939's "The Wizard of Oz") and human relationships are flipped on their heads.

The song, "For Good," is a duet between two friends who have been through tumultuous times as well as heart-warming bonding, but are now facing a moment of saying goodbye for the last time, seemingly never to be together again. It is an existential moment fresh for me as my good friend Lou, who partnered with me in many an adventure and whom I introduced to many of you, has now passed away. At the same time, we are anticipating the transition that will come in a few months when I will be leaving having completed my role as Intentional Interim Pastor. And so, on both fronts, a little reflection on the lyrics of that song about the possible meaning of relationships that goes beyond simply ships passing in the night.

The heartfelt refrain as these two friends reflect says simply: "Who can say if I've been changed for the better?/But Because I knew you/I have been changed for good." The verses in which that sentiment is interspersed build a story of a relationship which is complex, but who's complexity give it texture and richness that obviously make it real and significant.

I've heard it said
That people come into our lives
For a reason
Bringing something we must learn
And we are led to those
Who help us most to grow
If we let them
And we help them in return
Well, I don't know if I believe that's true
But I know I'm who I am today
Because I knew you

It well may be
That we will never meet again
In this lifetime
So let me say before we part
So much of me
Is made of what I learned from you
You'll be with me
Like a handprint on my heart
And now whatever way our stories end
I know you have rewritten mine
By being my friend

And just to clear the air
I ask forgiveness
For the things I've done
you've blamed me for
But then, I guess
We know there's blame to share
And none of it seems to matter anymore

I think all of those lyrics apply to the indelible way my time with you has continued to shape who I am. How could it be different? Just like with my friend, Lou, when you spend time in and around one another's lives—the good and bad, the happy and the sad—how can it not make a change in you that lasts forever, For Good. But like those double entendres I love so well, the song's lyrics, and my own thoughts will not leave you hanging. Because the final resolution is:

Who can say if I've been changed for the better?
I do believe I have been changed for the better
Because I knew you
I have been changed
For good

2000 years ago, God started all of this by intervening in human history. That tiny baby in a simple manger started a message of Love that has sent ripples throughout the ages. The Christmas we celebrate this month has had profound consequences that are for good, forever, or as we say eternal. And we cannot forget that Love is what gives the wicked, the sinner, the opportunity to be a saint. Well, maybe that is why they say there is no rest for the wicked. We have understood that this life we share is beyond ourselves. After all, that song is a duet. It is a reflection of all sides of the relationship. And so, especially at Christmas, we are out working in Williston, out working in the World, on behalf of that baby, "For Good!"

Merry Christmas to all of you at First Lutheran to whom I feel we were brought together for good!

The story of the birth of Jesus Christ, a very familiar story, is one we hear, sing about, and talk about every year. Kids are filled with anticipation and excitement. There are movies and TV shows produced every year to help us "feel the Christmas spirit." Adults work hard to make it the "perfect" Christmas for our families. But, what if any one of the characters in the Christmas story had said "No, not gonna do it, find someone else?" After all they all would have had good reasons for refusing to do what they were being asked to do.

What if the shepherds had said, "No can't leave my sheep to chase some star." Would the message of the light of Christ coming into the world have spread to the people that really needed to hear it? Would anyone come to declare Christ the King of Kings?

What if Joseph had said, "Nope I don't want to marry some girl that got pregnant by someone else?" Mary would have been an unwed mother in a time and place where she could have been stoned for her transgressions. Mary could have been dismissed as a bad girl that could not be part of the community.

What if Mary had said, "No, not interested in getting pregnant before marriage?" She could have gone on with her life, married Joseph, considered to be a good man, and had a good life. She could have been a good wife and mother and a well-liked and active member of her community.

There are others in the story that could have also said no. The Wise Men could have said OK we will go to Herod and tell him where to find Jesus. Zacheriah and Elizabeth could have said we're too old to raise a child. And even God could have said, "I'm not sending my son into that human mess. Let them deal with it themselves."

As you think about these questions and how much power each of those yeses has yielded in our world, think about the difference you could make in our community and in the world with that three-letter word, yes.

I am closing with a short poem I found by Madeleine L'Engle.

This is the irrational season when love blooms bright and wild. Had Mary been filled with reason there'd have been no room for the child.



We can all come up with infinite reasons to say no when asked to be part of something. But what if we responded like Mary or Joseph from our faith and simply answered yes?

FIRST LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES

November 11, 2025

Meeting called to order at 5:58 PM by Council Vice Chair Steve Slocum. Prayer was shared by all.

Roll Call: Travis Feiring, Jean Lindvig, Kathleen Sinclair, Beverly Conway, Steve Slocum, David Brevik, Sjon Zunich, Phyllis Stokke, Pauline Everson, Steve Rehak, Tucker Leibrand, Pastor Zach, Lynea Geinert.

Devotions: Pastor Zach shared verse and discussion from Proverb 15: 1-9. Plans of the Heart. Hector devotional; last verse – The Lord establishes his steps.

<u>Minutes</u> October 28 minutes were reviewed, and motion was made by Beverly Conway, 2nd by Steve Rehak, to accept the minutes as submitted. Motion passed. <u>Consent Agenda</u> There was an addition, 11.h – Church App. Motion by Sjon Zunich, 2nd by Pauline Everson to approve the agenda as amended. Motion passed.

<u>Pastor Report</u> – *Attached.* Pastor Zach requested that council approve as new members the three upcoming baptisms; L.M.O., B.J.H., and B.H.W. Motion made by David Brevik, 2nd by Kathy Sinclair that these be approved. Motion passed. He reminded us that Dec 3 is the first Advent service and Bishop Schweitzer will be here and blessing the newly renovated areas. The church office will be closed November 27 and 28 for the Thanksgiving holiday. Pastor Zach will be gone December 25 to January 9. If the pastoral call goes through, Pastor Zach will work month to month rather than complete a new contract.

<u>Deacon Report</u> - Attached. Befrienders is currently serving 51 people. Thanksgiving cards have been mailed. 16 people have received Good Sam assistance. FLC will join in Thanksgiving worship at Gloria Dei, with pie social to follow. Lynea reported that she is working with Gloria Dei on the Christmas meal boxes. She asked for volunteers to help with the food pantry. Volunteers may call Jocelyn at Gloria Dei, and days of work are Tuesday and Thursday. Befrienders is serving the first Advent meal, December 3rd. Due to the Golden Estates moving their worship to Thursday, Lynea's work days are now Monday, Tuesday and Thursday. She will preach in Pastor Zach's absence December 28 and January 4.

Staff Reports -None

<u>Financial Report</u> –(Treasurer's Report attached) Finances are on target. Motion by Steve Slocum and 2nd by Pauline Everson to accept financial report. Motion passed.

Committee reports –

Worship and Music Committee – Attached - Christmas Eve plans are being made. There is hope for a brass group and a few solos. Details will be finalized at the December meeting.

Sound System – Challenges were explained. There is a request to pursue a grant from Trust to have a team come and make a shopping list of equipment needed and get it installed. Motion by David Brevik, 2nd by Steve Slocum to pursue this goal and report at the February 2026 Council meeting.

<u>Property Committee.</u> – Parsonage is being brought up to date. A new 20 KW generator will be installed and fence finished up. A pay down has been made on the renovation loan from Trust.

<u>Youth and Congregational Life Committee.</u> – Volunteers will be asked to complete a Safe Gatherings seminar on line and have background checks.

Personnel Committee. Members will meet with staff for review and transition purposes as needed.

Marketing Committee. Nothing to report at this time.

Call Committee. Has been requested to move 'fire up' on acquiring an Associate Pastor.

<u>Christian Concerns Committee</u> – Reports they have used their budget towards community needs.

Memorial Committee – Requests that the amount of grants that can be made outside of Council approval be raised to \$1500. Motion by David Brevik and 2nd by Pauline Everson to raise the amount requiring council approval to \$1500. Motion passe Finance Committee – No discrepancies noted.

OLD BUSINESS –

- 11a Building Update Lights upstairs will get new automatic switches.
- 11b Stewardship No discussion
- 11c Pre-School Lease No new action
- 11d Nominating Committee will also present resolutions if any are submitted. Some resolutions should be submitted for new committees.
- 11e Pictorial Directory tabled
- 11f Rural Church Contract and Terms no new action
- 11g Budget Cindy and Kathy start working on the budget next week.
- 11h Church App Jean will have a meeting with Zach Myhrer, Sam Maggard, Greg Larson, and Tucker Leibrand asap to define parameters of need and acquaint the team. Aside from the App, wifi issues were discussed in the building. David Brevik will contact ProIt.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 12a Mechanics of Call Process of Sunday's congregational meeting were discussed. The benefits package would be discussed and voted at the same time as the pastoral call vote.
- 12b Constitution update and Bylaw review. Jean presented the Constitution updated to the changes to the current ELCA Constitution changes presented at the 2025 Synod Assembly. She also explained the cover sheet, index, and attachment of the Trust By-laws proposed. Motion by Steve Slocum and 2nd by David Brevik to approve the updates to the Constitution and attachment of the Trust Bylaws, and have it ratified at the 2025 Annual Meeting. Motion passed.

The FLC By-.0Laws were reviewed this second time, with an attachment now of the resolutions and the updated index to reflect the attachment. Motion by David Brevik and 2nd by Pauline Everson to have the Bylaws as presented brought to be ratified by the congregation at the 2025 Annual Meeting. Motion Passed.

12c Annual Meeting – scheduled for January 25, 2026, after worship. Committees should have annual reports to the office by December 19, 2025.

12\d Request to use facility by Williston Band Booster to BakesCakes fundraiser on November 29. Motion by Dave Brevik, seconsed by Pauline Everson to approve and waive fees. Motion passed.

<u>Consent agenda.</u> Motion by Sjon Zunich, 2nd by Steve Slocum to approve the consent agenda and all items omitted from motions made previously. Motion passed.

Ideas/Exchanges/ Reflections. None at this time

The meeting closed at 8:11 p.m. after prayer for congregation members and Blessing.

FIRST LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES —NOVEMBER 16, 2025 SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

The meeting was called to order at 10:40 am by Council Chair Travis Feiring.

The purpose of this meeting was to review the Senior Pastor benefit package, and vote whether to approve the package and call or not call Pastor Stephen Hilding as Senior Pastor.

Council Chair Feiring reviewed the benefits package. He explained the ELCA guidelines were followed, as well as the points of a congregation of 1500 or higher, and his ordainment year, for a salary base of \$73,265. With other expenses of to the church the cost after benefits and other costs totaling \$112,328. Aside from that portion the church will provide a travel gift of \$2,500 a year for three years, and ARC membership to added well-being. He invited questions. There were none. Motion by David Hansen and Second by Baylee Hansen to approve the benefit package. Motion passed unanimously.

Council Chair Feiring repeated the voting qualifications for members while the voting member sign-up sheets made their way around the room and ballots were handed out.

A quorum was declared. Council Chair Feiring explained the voting process; simply to write 'Call' or 'No Call'. There were 89 persons signed on the sign-in sheets, of which 88 were voting members. Written, anonymous ballots were gathered and counted by Pauline Everson, Steve Rehak, Sjon Zunich and David Brevik.

The council chair announced that the vote was 80 for Call, and 7 for No Call.

The council chair remained neutral and one person on the sign-in sheet was not eligible to vote due to not being a confirmed member.

Council Chair Feiring thanked everyone for their part in this process and for being present to vote.

Motion by David Brevik to adjourn, second by Kathy Sinclair. Motion Passed unanimously.

Meeting adjourned.
