I wrote the words in green-blue crayon and continued to fill in the drawing on the weekly coloring sheet with the boy that had stolen my heart.

While we colored, one of the school teachers stopped and asked Masyn if he was being good. He shook his head affirmatively and pointed to his picture. She praised his artistry and said "Masyn, you listen to these nice ladies. They want to tell you about Jesus. That is the best thing you can

ever learn." She petted his mussed up hair and said "My mom used to tell me 'All you ever need is a smile on your face and Jesus in your heart!"

At her words, he jerked his head up, frantically pointed to the words on the page, and repeated "I be him!"
