ARE YOU THANKFUL?

On one occasion, Jesus was traveling to Jerusalem and passed through Samaria and Galilee. Happening upon a certain village, He saw ten men who were afflicted by leprosy. Because His fame had spread far and wide, the men raised their voices and said, “Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!” (Luke 17:13). As we might expect, Jesus responded to their plea: “‘Go, show yourselves to the priests.’ And so it was that as they went, they were cleansed” (Luke 17:14).

Now, put yourself in the place of these men. Leprosy was truly one of the deadliest diseases of the ancient world. Additionally, it was also contagious. For that reason, individuals afflicted with leprosy were separated from the rest of the population. Forced to leave family members, friends, and loved ones, lepers were made to dwell in communities with fellow lepers at some distance from the city. Now, imagine Jesus healed you. What would you do? Hopefully, you would have returned to thank Jesus. But sadly, only one of the men returned. Luke continued: “And one of them, when he saw that he was healed, returned, and with a loud voice glorified God, and fell down on his face at His feet, giving Him thanks. And he was a Samaritan. So Jesus answered and said, ‘Were there not ten cleansed? But where are the nine?’” (Luke 17:15-17).

As it was among the lepers, thankfulness is rare in our day, but that does not mean it is not needed. We should be thankful that Jesus can heal us spiritually (Romans 5:8); we should be thankful for the love of God (John 3:16); we should be thankful for the power of the gospel (Romans 1:16); we should be thankful for the fellowship of our brethren (Galatians 6:2).
