By the time you read this, most of autumn's leaves will have fallen.

By the time of our first midweek Advent service on December 3rd, winter will have announced its arrival. But another arrival is on the way too, declaring—not the season of winter—but the season of Advent. Advent will be announced this year with leaves—not falling leaves, but greening leaves.

You see, Advent will mark the Church's springtime. Springtime in December? "Yes," says Advent. For Advent is the arrival of faith's New Year. It announces new beginnings, new life, and new birth—the Birth of Jesus.

And, just as in springtime, new life is accompanied by signs of the leaves new growth.

That new growth will be the theme of each midweek Advent service. We will add new leaves to the bare limbs of the Advent Promise Tree until, week by week--just in time for December 24—those dead branches will be transformed into the brilliant green of the Christmas Tree.

Advent declares that now is the time for you to get ready—to green out with new growth.



Each leaf that we add to the Advent Promise Tree is a reminder that, day by day, the countdown to Christmas has begun. For God has handwritten God's promise "in every leaf of springtime" ... and in evey leaf of our Advent Promise Tree.

Deck the Halls


