I am thankful to the Endowment Committee who invited Chip Buckman to share with all who gathered for our legacy workshop

about the importance to understand and prepare paperwork that helps share our resources in the future. I strongly believe this is a <u>spiritual gift of stewardship</u> that is an important step in our journey of discipleship. Following is a synopsis of information shared at the Legacy Workshop. ESTATE PLANNING & GIFTING

On November 17th, the Endowment Committee sponsored a "Legacy Workshop" for the congregation. The committee's financial advisor spoke to the assembled group about "Estate Planning Basics – An Overview of the Estate Planning Process". A very healthy question and answer period yielded more information about the concerns of congregation members and ways to ensure proper stewardship of financial goals and aspirations. Paster Jill steered the group towards our Methodist principles of gifting and the opportunities to aid the church while at the same time safeguarding our primary responsibilities to our immediate families.

Here are some possibly helpful hints from the workshop, for those able and willing to aid the church during the estate planning process:

- *Donating appreciated stock. If you acquired stock at a low value which has now increased, by gifting it to the church, you avoid any capital gains on the increase, and the church receives 100% of the value. At least several members of the congregation have been good enough to contribute in this manner.
- * **IRA RMD Transfers**. If you have any traditional IRAs (usually received through your employment), once you reach the age of 73 the federal government requires you to withdraw a certain amount in an IRA yearly (called a "RMD"). Therefore, you pay income taxes on that amount transferred to you from the IRA.

A vehicle which some in the church have used is to have your IRA advisor. send a check from that fund directly to the church, in an amount determined by you. By doing so, you reduce your taxable income for the year and the church receives 100% of the value of the donation.

- * Annual Gift Exclusion Donations. You are presently entitled to donate up to \$19,000 per year to any individual or charity, including to our church without any requirement to pay income tax on that amount. This allows you to lower your income for that year, dollar for dollar. Additionally, these gifts are not counted against what is called your lifetime gift/estate exemption (which is actually a very high amount, but it might apply to some in the church).
- * Life insurance Beneficiaries. If you have an existing life insurance policy or are willing to take out a new one, by naming the Church as the beneficiary, you can provide a wonderful legacy to the benefit of the congregation. This approach has been utilized before, to the great benefit of our church.
- * Beneficiaries Under Your Will. By naming the church as a beneficiary in your will, you provide funds after you pass away, without concern about whether gifting during your lifetime might unduly impact your needs. Everyone should have a properly prepared and executed Will, Living Will/ Advanced Medical Directive and a General Durable Power of Attorney. By doing so, you protect your own medical and financial desires during your life and may provide great comfort to family members during your life and beyond.

If you do not have all of these or you have, but have not had them reviewed in years, you should consult with an attorney specializing in this field. If you do not have an attorney and wish to seek assistance, you could ask members of the church's Endowment Committee to see if they have any recommendations for you.

Follow up. The above is a summary of some of the estate planning options discussed at the workshop. The information above should not be considered professional advice. If you wish to follow up on any estate planning matters, you should consult with appropriate licensed advisors.


