Peace Lutheran Church is palpable every Sunday in the smiles and eagerness of PLC youth to learn about God. We are excited that the number of children has increased over the past few years such that we now have 3 classrooms full of children each Sunday. One classroom with 3-year-old, 4-year-old and kindergarten children, another with 1st and 2nd graders, and the last with 3rd, 4th and 5th graders. Praise God!

We continue to use the Spark Lectionary curriculum obtained from the Sundays and Seasons website. Lessons connect children with Bible stories, Bible verses and the word heard in worship. A story is read from the Spark Bible for the younger children and Bible verses that connect the story to the lesson are read from the Junior Spark Bible for the older children. I encourage all children to bring their Spark Bible with them to Sunday School each Sunday. Carrying bags (handmade with love by Jeannine Peterson) provide ease of bible and lesson transportation. If your child(ren) need(s) either a Bible or a carrying bag, please let me know.

I'd like to take a moment and thank the teachers and assistants who are the heart of the success in the youth program. Teachers include: Kathy Forster, Kim Lehmann, Stacey Rogers, Brianna Forster, Jamie Lehmann and Patty Bosse. Additionally, the following individuals assist with the lessons and classroom activities: Marissa Talmage, Sally Gates, Leah Webster (UW-Stout Student), Pat Mikesell (Pianist), Shawn Swaewnepoel (Council Liaison), Pastor Augie Hohl, and Kalani Krautbauer (PLC Secretary). PLC is so blessed.

The children sang in church on Sunday October 12th. They sang "The Butterfly Song" and "All Night All Day". They did a fantastic job. The video was posted on the PLC website with several views and many positive comments. Thank you, children.

Children will continue to collect "noisy offering" during the church service. Money was given to three area schools (Elk Mound Middle School, Boyceville Elementary School, and Menomonie Schools) to be used to purchase items and or provide for those students who are in need. Money will be given to Stepping Stones on Wednesday October 29th as part of confirmation and Sunday School collaboration.

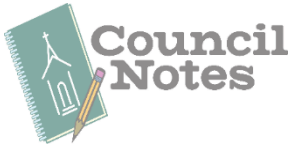

Dear Friends at Peace Lutheran church,
on behalf of The Bridge to Hope, thank

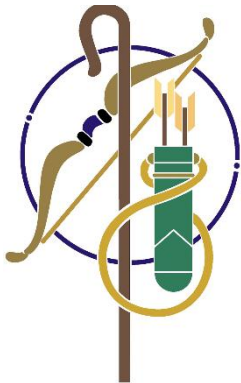

Thankofferings are a long-standing and spiritual practice among women of faith. We give in thanksgiving for blessings received--and we do receive so many blessings, don't we? The Women of the ELCA decided back in 1988 that Thankofferings are to support ongoing ministries of the churchwide women's organization. These include our many online and printed communications channels, (such as www.womenoftheelca.org website), our justice and advocacy work, training and development for elected leaders throughout the women's organization, our constant work in support of congregational and synodical women's organizations, the administration of our grants and scholarship programs, all that goes into our triennial convention, and so much more.

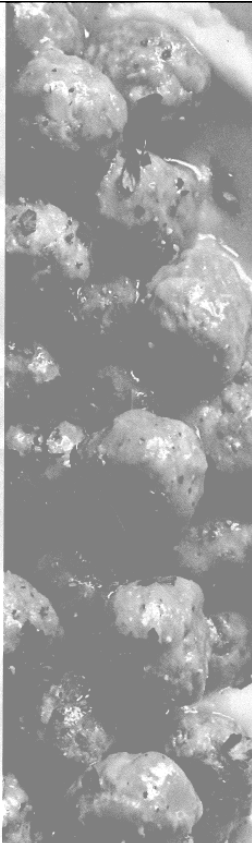

Habitat for Humanity - Patty reported that both homes built in Menomonie are now occupied. Plans to develop two more homes will occur in 2026!

JONAH – Green Bandana Project-Mental Health Task Force

This is a program that raises mental health awareness, reduces stigma, and connects students to mental health and suicide prevention resources. Green is the color of mental health awareness. Individuals go through a short training course, carry resource cards, and tie a green bandana to a visible location as a way to let people know that they are a member of the Green Bandana Project and a trusted person who knows how and where to reach out for help. The Menomonie school district has trained 43 students to the Green Bandana project with assistance of Lynn Buske! SDMA is the first school in the Chippewa Valley to have provided student training!

The idea is to have upper classmates trained and then paired with incoming Freshmen to provide support.

Pastor Augie volunteered to be trained as a support person!
