As with the Church of the ages we will begin Lent with repentance and the imposition of ashes, leaning on the God of grace



January & February Mission Action Project: Personal Care Kits—Lutheran World Relief

- 1 bath towel (approximately 52" x 27") dark color recommended
- 2 bars of new bath size soap (4-5 oz.), any brand, in its original packaging
- 1 adult-sized toothbrush, in its original packaging*
- 1 sturdy comb, wide tooth, remove packaging
- 1 metal nail clipper, remove packaging
- Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business envelope, no plastic bags or wrap.

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new and in good condition.

Wrap all the items in the towel and tie securely with ribbons or yarn. Do not enclose the kit or any of its content in plastic bags.


