Pastor's Message

It's early on Sunday morning. The sun's light is bright, but it hasn't yet

crested the horizon. So, the Sanctuary is dark-ish, the windows are aglow. Very peaceful.

Outside, way above, is the spotlight shining through the round window

above the Altar. It adds an extra glow to this window but also illuminates the Altar

which is set and ready for Bethlehemites and friends to come for Holy

Communion. Again, very peaceful. Just stop in your reading, visualize this picture,

and sense the peace of Jesus flooding in.

This is the Table which is holding simple offerings of bread and wine. The

elements and the cloths & amp; paraments have been lovingly and reverently prepared

and placed for the meal about to begin. We now see a Table, so that when we

celebrate Holy Communion, people are all around the Table, just like at home, just

like at the Last Supper.

This is the Table that connects us with that Last Supper, on the night before

our Lord Jesus was betrayed. Thursday evening. Then after the meal all went to the

Garden in which Jesus prayed, and to which Judas came with soldiers to arrest

Jesus. Then throughout the night He was placed under a mock trial, ultimately

having a decision rendered by Pilate for crucifixion. Friday from about 9-3 He

hung, until at the last He



cried, "It is Finished." Then just before dark. He was

placed in the tomb. Until Sunday – alleluia! – until Sunday when he rose!

Alleluia! This Table ties us into that weekend.

This is the Table on which we proclaim that Jesus is present, as He

promised, in the bread and wine. We "taste" forgiveness. We "receive" His

presence in, with, and under these simple elements. Jesus is here FOR YOU, and

for the whole world. And you are loved.

This is the Table that mom and dad, grandparents, families and friends have

come to and have received Jesus. Here at Bethlehem and around the world, for

about 2000 years. We all gather around this Table as the "communion of saints,"

one Body of Christ both present physically here and present in God's eternal

Heaven. We're all here, at this Table.

This is the Table at which you and I will be brought at our "end." Others will

mourn, songs will be song,

scriptures proclaimed. But here, in spite of what is

visible, we know that the Resurrection is our future – for you and me, for...

This is the Table to which we come, some of us old, some very young, some

fully aware and thankful for grace and the presence of Jesus, some no longer able

to fully remember, some just learning, but trusting that Jesus is here. We come

with all our burdens to the cross and receive peace. We come with all our joys to

the tomb and receive hope. We come, and in Jesus, there is peace.

The day will come when this Table will be glorious, and around it will sing

multitudes from every time and land and place, along with angels and archangels,

cherubim and seraphim. We will sing, "Holy, Holy, Holy is the Lord of hosts!" Ah,

it will all be good...forever. Alleluia! Even now, the angels and saints sing with

us each Sunday, with this specific congregation, as we give praise to the Lord of

All. Here, at this Table.

So, come to this Table. Sense the peace and presence of Jesus that surrounds

us. Rejoice in the noise and activities of young and old saints sitting in our pews.

And when you receive the gift of bread and wine, know in your heart that Jesus is

there for you – always! Thanks be to God.

Mission Honduras: A Step of Faith in Southern Honduras

Last May, we traveled to four remote villages in Southern Honduras to begin distributing water filters. The largest village, Los Higueros, has about 140 homes. Our plan was to provide filters to half the families in May and return in January to complete the rest. But when we arrived, Santos, our local advocate, asked if we could find a way to serve all 140 homes during our visit. Families not scheduled to receive filters feared they'd be forgotten, having often been overlooked by government and aid programs.

It was a leap of faith. We'd prepared for seventy homes—just enough filters, buckets, and syringes, just enough daylight to return safely to Nuevo Paraiso, and enough supplies for the rest of the week's visits. Most importantly, we wanted to ensure there was enough time with each family—to teach, to listen, to connect. But after prayerful reflection, a discussion with our team, and checking our supplies, we said yes. It was a very busy, long day but every home in Los Higueros received a filter that week. We also promised to return in January to each of the four villages. This ministry is not just about clean water. It's also about providing hope and the knowledge that someone cares. Thank you for your support of this ministry!

Guests- Denise Corns and Teri Hanson provided a preschool update to Council.

The preschool has 15 employees and 9 part time employees. Total of 70 students.

There are 44 preschool students and 74 elementary students that use extended care.

There is a scholarship fund available and donations go into that fund.

Denise is working on air filters that need updates

A new grant was applied for the air filters replacement.

Preschool will be purchasing a couple of drinking fountains for 2nd floor
