GOSPEL MESSAGE

December 25, 2025 NATIVITY OF OUR LORD, CHRISTMAS DAY Ponder Anew

The story of Christmas is loud, and chaotic, and surprising, and even terrifying. And then there's Mary. She seems so steady, so calm. The shepherds show up, full of energy and wonder and questions. They have so much to say to this small family about what has happened to them. What does Mary do? She treasures their words and ponders them in her heart.

By the time we get to Christmas Day, the hustle and bustle is over in some households. In other households, the hustle and bustle is just beginning, but the lead-up is over. The season of anticipation—both liturgical and commercial—is over; this baby has arrived.

What is it that we treasure? What is this season calling us to ponder in our hearts? Maybe we, too, have had a loud, and chaotic, and surprising, and even terrifying season. Does our understanding of this incarnation cause us to make decisions in a new light?
