

CANDLE LIGHTING: THROUGH THE EYES OF THE WATCHER

As we enter Advent, we begin with the watcher – the one who rises in the quiet hours, who listens to the land, who waits with reverent attention for signs of God already moving among us.

The first candle is lit.

We light this candle as a sign of our watching: not anxious, not fearful, but awake – ready to notice the nearness of the Holy in the ordinary moments of our days.

O God, awaken our hearts. Teach us to watch with humility, to listen with our whole being, and to meet this season with open eyes. In the stillness, draw us close, and make us ready for your coming. Amen.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION:
