

Vicar's Voice

Joining in His Chorus

Hello Again,

Music is wonderful! Last week, we had our annual Deanery Service of Lessons and Carols. It was both an uplifting experience and a fitting way to begin the Advent Season.

I am always amazed at how music touches and moves people in ways that reach far deeper than simply the spoken word. Our faith tradition possesses a rich repertoire of hymns whose writers have clearly been inspired by the **Holy Spirit**.

In Scripture, most, if not all the Psalms were set to music. Also, if you look below the Psalm heading, you will notice that the psalm has been set to a particular tune. King David must have been quite the musician. In his younger, **shepherding days**, David was often summoned by Saul to come and play for him to soothe his heart and fend off the dark spirits that tormented him. (1 Samuel 16:23).

The New Testament abounds with examples of the remarkable mysterious impact of music. Zechariah was moved to song upon the announcement of the birth of John the Baptist. Mary was moved to sing after she received the **Good News** that she was to bear a son called Immanuel –God with us. Later, an Angelic band was formed and proclaimed the message of the Sacred birth to the shepherds in the fields.

When we encounter Christ, the experience evokes an emotional response. Often this response of praise is offered in song. Singing provides a marvelous response and outpouring of gratitude, praise and worship for Who God is and what He has done. As we often notice, not only does music draw us to God, but it also draws us together and we become more closely connected to one another.

My friends, in this **season of Advent**, amid all the hectic plans and functions, we are urged to perk up our ears to hear the still, small voice of God. God is speaking to us. God often sings to us. He wants us to hear His song of love to us. We are urged to listen to His sweet voice and join His Chorus.

May God's Peace take root in your hearts.
