Welcome to the Cathedral Church of the Anglican Diocese of British Columbia. Here we respectfully acknowledge that we gather to worship on the ancestral lands of the Esquimalt and Songhees Nations, with whom we are in relationship to seek reconciliation.

As an Anglican centre for spirituality, learning, culture, heritage and community, this cathedral upholds a daily rhythm of worship in the heart of Victoria. From daily spoken and sung services to the weekly celebration of the Eucharist and Choral Evensong, we mark the important events of the Christian calendar and in the life of our diocese and the wider community.

Christ Church Cathedral is a fully inclusive community where all are invited to hear God's Word and partake of God's bread, regardless of upbringing or creed. Please join as fully as you wish in every action of our worship, including communion. This is God's house and all are welcome.

A note about the service

Advent is the start of the Christian year. Our liturgical life begins in waiting and active preparation. In the darkness of the natural world, we light candles, sing songs of expectation, read the prophecies of the coming of God into our world, and look toward Christmas and the incarnation of the Christ.

Advent is considered a penitential season, though different in nature from Lent. The penitence of this season is waiting in a world that wants everything available and realized right now. It is in making space in our hearts for the Christ Child to be born anew amidst a culture that tries to fill every moment with activity and every silence with noise. It is in holding fast to faith, hope, joy, and love when those seem sometimes naïve in our society. These are counter-cultural actions and so we practice them together in our liturgy – the work of the people.

Liturgically you will notice the change to purple vestments – the colour the church associates with penance, but also the colour of royalty as we await the coming of the King of kings. We increase moments of silence to help us remember to wait expectantly for what is coming. We always use a confession and absolution in advent. We confess because we are bad at waiting and often fail to prepare, and in the absolution we are reminded that none of this depends on us because God is faithful and loving and will come anyway. We begin the service with the lighting of the advent wreath, an active symbol of pushing back the darkness and embodying the light of God in the world. You are invited to join fully in all of these liturgical aspects as we prepare together for the mystery of Christmas.

On the night before he died for us, Jesus was at table with his friends. He took bread, gave thanks to you, broke it, and gave it to them, and said: "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you.

Do this for the remembrance of me."

As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine. Again, he gave thanks to you, gave it to them, and said: "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Now gathered at your table, O God of all creation, and remembering Christ, crucified and risen, who was and is and is to come, we offer to you our gifts of bread and wine, and ourselves, a living sacrifice.

Pour out your Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Body and Blood of Christ.

Breathe your Spirit over the whole earth and make us your new creation, the Body of Christ given for the world you have made.

In the fullness of time bring us, with the blessed virgin Mary and all your saints, from every tribe and language and people and nation, to feast at the banquet prepared from the foundation of the world.

Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, to you be honour, glory, and praise, for ever and ever.

All are invited to receive communion, which will be distributed at the communion rail. A reminder that intinction (or dipping the bread into the cup) is considered unsafe, and is thus not permitted. If you have mobility issues, you may remain seated and communion will be brought to you.

Prayers for healing with the laying-on-of-hands and anointing may be sought in the Lady Chapel (to the left of the high altar) during today's Communion. You may ask for prayers for yourself, or for the needs of another. Information shared during these prayers is kept in the strictest confidence.
