Keep us awake until the hour of Christ's coming, when the sun and moon and stars will fall from heaven and you will gather up the faithful from the ends of the earth.


Through Christ, with Christ, in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor are yours, almighty God, now and forever.
