## A Letter from the Pastor: Remembering the Saints

Dear Disciples of Jesus Christ:

I love the movie "The Prince of Egypt." If you haven't seen it I strongly encourage you to watch it. There is one song in particular that I want to focus on. It's called, "Through Heaven's Eyes." It takes place after Moses has killed the Egyptian, after he realizes that he has treated his own Jewish brothers and sisters literally like slaves, after he has been told that his whole life is based on a lie. He runs wildly through the wilderness and eventually ends up exhausted near the area of Midian. As a result of everything that he has done, he comes to the conclusion that his life is completely worthless. Then he

meets Jethro, the High Priest of Midian. Jethro sings to Moses and tells him that he can't realize his value and his worth from this limited human perspective. He cannot know his value to God. Moses is an intricate part of God's plan. Jethro compares one person's life to a thread in a tapestry or one small rock on the peak of a mountain. He teaches Moses to look at his life, the way that God looks at it. As one part of God's huge overarching master plan.
