Introduction

This companion guide follows the daily Morning Prayer videos for Advent 2025. The series runs from Monday, December 1st, through Tuesday, December 23rd - 17 weekday prayers leading to Christmas Eve.

Pray along with the video, or use this guide for personal prayer when you cannot watch.

The Four Weeks

Week 1: The Watcher (December 1-5)
