1. God Looks at the Heart

1 Samuel 16:7 (NLT) "People judge by outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart."

God looks past our outward appearance and sees our heart.

God doesn't choose the most impressive; He chooses the most willing.

David wasn't perfect, but he was authentic.

God values **authenticity** over **perfection**.

2. Faith Is Caught More Than Taught

Rusty wasn't impressed with Clark... but he caught his dad's heart, not his mistakes.

Kids don't need parents who never fail—just parents who never fake it.

Kids need parents who don't **fake** it .

Psalm 78 — Passing Faith to the Next Generation

<u>Psalm 78:4–7 (NLT)</u> "We will tell the next generation about the glorious deeds of the Lord... Then each generation will set its hope anew on God."

God's plan is simple: <u>tell</u> the next generation His stories.

The goal is for each generation to set its **hope** on God.

3. What Real Faith Looks Like at Home

Real faith is consistent.

Patterns preach louder than words.

Real faith shows up.

Real faith depends on God openly.

Pray. Worship. Serve. Let them see it.

Let them hear you pray. Let them watch you trust.

Your **patterns** preach louder than your **words**.

4. What's at Stake

Real faith apologizes.

Your kids will model what you magnify.

Your habits become their defaults.

Your walk with God becomes their expectation of God.
