HELP MAKE A DIFFERENCE

The problems of the world can be so overwhelming that we sometimes feel we cannot make a difference. However, sometimes the Lord shows us how we can help.

There are over 31 million refugees in the world in 2025. More than 6 million refugees are living in camps.

You can help make a difference to one family.

Eight years ago Medi Ojulu and Ajany Odiel came to St Paul's with their children as a refugee family. Originally from Ethiopia, Medi and Ajany had been in a refugee camp in Kenya for 12 years. The family received great support from members of our congregation and are now beloved members of St Paul's.

We now have another opportunity to help.

Medi is bringing his sister, her husband and their eight children to Australia. The parents have been in the refugee camp for 20 years. Medi is paying the Australian government for their flights as refugees. For the family of 10 the flights will cost around \$18,500. Medi has already paid a deposit of \$9,800.

St Paul's, with the support of our pastors, Church Council, and the Justice and Mercy team, will accept retiring offerings for this cause each Sunday in November.

We are asking members of St Paul's if they feel it in their hearts to help support Medi with the costs of bringing his sister and her family to safety in Australia.

We who have so much can make a difference in the lives of others through our generosity.

Donations can be made on leaving church during November or by a clearly noted donation to the church bank account.

ADVENT ACTIONS - ANGEL TREE

The following article is from a recent Prison Fellowship newsletter, highlighting the role of Angel Tree.

When you give an Angel Tree gift at Christmas time, you remind a child with a parent in prison they are loved and not forgotten.

Each Christmas across the country, thousands of children unwrap Angel Tree gifts – presents given to them on behalf of their mum or dad in prison who don't have the means to do so themselves while inside.

It's a ministry made possible through our partnership with hundreds of churches and thousands of volunteers – and your generous donations. As well as bringing joy to kids on Christmas morning, your Angel Tree gift helps maintain the special connection between a child and their mum or dad, letting children know their parent still loves them and is thinking of them.

Very much part of the story, inmates themselves nominate their children for Angel Tree, sharing their child's age, interests and suggested gifts. And the impact doesn't stop with the kids – your support deeply touches parents and carers, letting them know they are not facing this difficult season alone.

Dear Sir/Madam,

My name is Jeremy* and I am currently incarcerated in prison. I am writing to thank you personally for your support to prisoners and their families through programs such as the Christmas Angel Tree.

I have been in prison now for two Christmases and was informed last September about Angel Tree.

The first Christmas I spent in prison was the most difficult, upsetting and challenging time in my life as I couldn't be there with my children or even provide them a gift to celebrate this special time of year.

I was raised in a home where Christmas was valued as the most special and magical time of the year. To be absent from my family and unable to even send my children a Christmas gift ripped my heart out.

After hearing about the Angel Tree program, I wrote to your organisation with the hope of my children being included. To my delight, my children were part of the program this past Christmas and received a present from me.

It brought a tear to my eye to see their utter joy and to think that, even though I couldn't be there with them, I had been able to send them a present and watch them unwrap it during a video call.

Your organisation is such a Godsend for families like mine and the good work you do cannot be underestimated. You help bring love and joy to the lives of young children with a parent in custody and the help you provide is much appreciated.

I want to thank you personally for this and for all the support that you provide prisoners and their families.


MEMORIAL PLAQUES FOR ST PAUL'S MEMORIAL GARDEN

Now that the Memorial Garden, on the north west corner of our church property, is complete, we would like to offer an opportunity for interested families to add a plaque in honour of any loved one who has been a member or friend of St Paul's during their life. The memorial plaques will be installed on the wall (pictured right). There are about 160 spots available.



We have selected a preferred supplier, whose plaques are made from a metallic engraving laminate, engineered for exceptional corrosion resistance, UV stability and outdoor weatherability. The brushed appearance mimics a premium metal look - without a premium price tag. Current cost is around \$50, including delivery. Pictured at right are a couple of their sample plaques.

Each plaque for our wall should measure 20cm x 13cm, and can be made in one of the following colour choices (with silver and brass being recommended choices):




