- What are you looking forward to (or concerned about) most this Christmas?

Discussion Questions

- 1. Read John 1:1-5. What does it mean that "In the beginning was the Word"?
 - Why do you think John begins his story of Jesus so much before the other gospels do (cf. John 8⁵⁸)?
- For Jewish and Greek audiences at the time, what are the different implications of calling Jesus "the Word" (logos)?
- 3. How do verses 1-2 present both the *divinity* and *distinctness* of the "Word" and "God the Father"? What is the nature of their relationship (cf. verse 18)?
- 4. What role in creation is attributed to the Word in verse 3 (cf. Col. 1¹⁶)?
 - How does this verse challenge the idea that the universe came into existence from nothing (on its own)?
- 5. In what way(s) is Jesus the source of "life" (v.4)?
- 6. What does it mean to be the "light of all mankind" (cf. Ps. 271; Ps. 369)?
- 7. How do the concepts of light and darkness in this passage (and in John's gospel) represent a spiritual struggle (cf. John 3^{2a, 19-21})?
- 8. How does verse 5 offer hope and strength during difficult times or in the face of widespread evil in the world?
- 9. How would you explain the core message of John 1:1-5 to a non-believer or someone unfamiliar with Christianity?
