Dear Friends in Christ,

In the book of Matthew, Jesus gives us his instructions on prayer. We can and should use the Lord's Prayer as a template for our prayers. The Lord's prayer is simple opening up with who our Father is. Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name.

By acknowledging that he is Holy we acknowledge what we are. In other words, poor miserable sinners. Some might say He made a mistake with us, but you and I know and believe it is because of original sin. For in the beginning when They had finished creating us, They said it was good. Our confession we use on Sunday is really on point with who we are in a fallen world. If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. So let's look at how Jesus would have us pray.

Matthew 6:9-14 "This, then, is how you should pray: "'Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, 10 your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

11 Give us today our daily bread. 12 And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. 13 And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from the evil one.'

14 For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. 15 But if you do not forgive others their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins.

When you read this prayer in the light of we are sinners because of original sin you realize the magnitude of God's grace and mercy for us in Christ Jesus. We are forgiven on account of Christ. He has redeemed us with His blood.

Then on top of that He provides for our every need. In the United States unfortunately our wants always seem to transform to our needs. We know that in reality needs are just that what you need for life. And God gives us much more that we actually need for our daily lives.

Now we come to the one that seems very difficult for us...forgiving others. But take a look at the word order. We are instructed by Jesus to ask our Father in Heaven to forgive us first before we forgive others. The fact is as we talked in Bible Study Sunday our Human Nature does now allow or enable us to forgive others. For some people their human nature might make it impossible to forgive ourselves.

The fact is that God freely forgives us on account of Christ. Think about everything God had done for you. Providing for your needs, comforting you when you suffer, and the biggest one... forgiving your sins. The creator of us and the universe forgiving you. We are then moved by faith to love others and when they wrong us, we are drawn forgive them.

As we live our lives remember we live in a fallen world, but Christ as redeemed us. Many around us are suffering and may have had events in their lives that are beyond words to describe the aftereffects. As Saint Paul says such forward put the new self on. We have Christ walk in the spirit of Love, Patience and Kindness.




Tim and Mary Tobeck have joined the Stewardship Board. They will share the duties of processing and depositing the weekly offering with Rollin and Pat Duckwitz.
