Summary Report of Cultural Identity Tour

Thank you to everyone who took the time to participate in the Cultural Discovery Tour!

As a Vision Team, we are on a spiritual journey looking for God to reveal what the next faithful step will be for St. Andrew. We know that "next step" must be rooted in our past and our congregation's culture and your participation and responses have helped in that regard. We especially recognize the value of the group discussions that followed the "tours" and encourage you to continue those discussions. We know that God is not done with St Andrew. God has plans for our future in this changing world and we need to work to discern what those may be. We also know that our next step will be like a new chapter in the book of St Andrew and that it is important that it carries forward all the rich history of the previous chapters of that book.

We learned that, for those who have experienced much of the congregation's history, that history is very important. There are memories formed in our building that are cherished by many. These memories and experiences include the meeting of new friends and the saying goodbye to old friends. The primary question asked in the cultural discovery Tour questions was

"How would you describe our culture?"

The number one answer to that question was a culture which was "Traditional" or "Old Time" traditional (and that being a good thing).

There were also some responses that stated our culture was "Tired" or "Out of date" and "Stuck in the past".

One response bridged the above thoughts by stating our "Our culture reflects our history but looks to the future".
