LEADERSHIP TEAM NEWS FOR DECEMBER 2025

Welcome to the month of December with its joyous celebration of the birth of our Lord! The sanctuary and the altar will be decorated. Our youth are hosting a cookie social time after worship service. Pastor Joe's sermons and Jesse's and our Singing Saints' musical selections will highlight the birth of our Lord!

Your Leadership Team met on Monday, November 10°. Pastor announced the church conference in Medina on Sunday, November 16° at 3pm. (Pastor, Judy, and Aleah were able to represent our church. Much appreciated! At that conference, Aleah was officially appointed as Amherst UMC'S Lay Leader! Pastor suggested that Christmas Eve service be at 4pm rather than 7pm so driving could be done during daylight. Team agreed. (Pastor surveyed our congregation at the Sunday worship service and 4pm was agreed upon.)

Our treasurer Jim will have a proposed 2026 budget for the December Leadership team meeting. The craft show and bake sale profited \$846.75 for the general fund. For the Ark Encounter trip in June of 2026, the children have raised \$1,019.30 of their \$2,500.00 goal. If the children are unable to attain their goal, Leadership Team will discuss ways to cover the remaining balance. Aleah said that at this time no money needs to be expended for the trip. JoAnn and Diane reported that fifteen pledge cards for 2026 have been turned in with an estimated pledge amount of \$30,080. (Thank you to Diane for attending and assuming the financial secretary's role in January 2026! JoAnn will continue to assist and remain on Leadership Team.)

Bob, trustee chair, reported that the air conditioner for the office and Elsie Snell room is installed. Unfortunately, there is no electrical hook up. There is seventeen inches of solid sandstone that separates location of electrical panel for the hook up. Bob has contacted an electrician so that a remedy may be found. (Fortunately, the air conditioner will not be needed at this time of year!) Doug Haney attended our meeting and asked about installation of a hand rail leading to the altar to make it more convenient for the Pastor, Singing Saints, and liturgists. Doug provided printed copies of suggested installations. Team felt that this would be beneficial. Bob and Doug will pursue various installation options. (Thank you to Doug for his stewardship!) Jennifer Clark provided an update on the cost of painting the sanctuary ceiling. Tad and Jennifer Clark are donating their time and talents! Jennifer will bring paint sample strips to the next Leadership Team meeting so that a choice can be made. The paint will cost between six hundred and one thousand dollars, depending upon our choice. This work will be done during the winter months. (Thank you to the Clarks for their stewardship!)

Kathy with nurturing reported that our church Christmas party is Saturday, December 6* at 2pm at Martino's in Vermilion. Sign up is available with three menu choices of beef, fish, or chicken. Kathy also noted that postage has increased and also food items needed for St. Elizabeth's meals and our church social time celebrations

ie. New membership and consecration Sundays

These expenses support our church's goal to effectively interact with our homebound and continue community outreach.

Judy, worship chair, advised that the first week of Advent will be November 30^a and hanging of the Greens will be on November 29^a at 10am. Poinsettias from PineHaven are ten dollars each and order forms are in the pews.

Chris with Raise Right is taking Christmas gift card orders. Also, Chris is working with Pastor and others on the website. This is another way that our church goal to emphasis community outreach is being accomplished.

Polly with Missions reported that currently we are collecting socks for St. Elizabeth with a goal of one hundred. Next mission's project will be collection of hats and mittens plus canned goods for Second Harvest. (Last year our altar was adorned with a tower of canned goods! Thank all for their giving!) Polly asked that our youth write a prayer or words of encouragement to put with the hats and mittens before they are distributed.

Jill, SPRC chair, reported that she had spoken with Colleen, our custodian, regarding cleaning of the pews. Colleen does do a deep vacuum cleaning, but the dusty look is due to faded pews. After the sanctuary ceiling is painted, a professional company will be contacted for further cleaning.

Aleah, our lay leader and youth education coordinator, reported that the craft show vendors enjoyed themselves and sixteen of the twenty-one vendors wish to return. (Your Leadership team applauded Aleah for completing a successful craft show! She indicated that this was her very first one. Super job!!) Aleah reported that the youth group evacuation drill went well and that she and Pastor Joe had attended a safe house of worship training, too. (As you have been informed, our church doors are locked shortly after 10:30am on Sunday. Ring the bell, if you arrive late. Another way we wish to engage in safe practices.) Aleah reported on upcoming Amherst Main Street event (see Aleah's information within this newsletter). Another way to emphasis community outreach church goal. Aleah said that Main Street Amherst is compiling welcome packets for new residents. The leadership team decided to include our brochure, hall rental flyer, and clothing shed flyer within the packets.

Jennifer Clark announced that another photo day is scheduled for Sunday, December 14° after worship service. (These photos are for the church directory which is being updated. (Please look at the directory on the table outside the sanctuary and make any additions/corrections needed. If you are unable to attend church, you will be contacted to update/confirm your information. We will continue to work on the directory into 2026 to provide as much accuracy as possible. Thank you, Jennifer, for your donation of photographic skills. Much appreciated!

Next Leadership Team meeting is scheduled for Monday, December 8 at 11am. All are welcome to attend! A thank you to Jennifer and Diane and Doug and Jay for attending our

November meeting and for their valuable contributions!
