Q & A by Sue Green Secretary Ashley December 2025

Ashley Graas has been hired as our new secretary at Fredsville. I thought that you would enjoy getting to know more about her.

Q: Where did you grow up and attend high school?

A: I was born in St. Cloud Florida and spent 12 years there. For those who are unfamiliar with St. Cloud, it is located in the outskirts of Orlando Florida. I moved to Tallahassee Florida in 2000. I attended high school in Tallahassee Florida at Lawton Chiles High School where I graduated with honors.

Q: Have you had any post-secondary training? What is your degree in? A: I have a varying range of types of employment and degrees. In the summer of 2019, I did my first term with Green Iowa AmeriCorps. I later did a 6-month term and 11-month term with them as the Energy and Community Outreach Coordinate in 2020 and 2021. Q: Could you explain what the Green Iowa AmeriCorps is for those that aren't familiar with it?

A: AmeriCorps is a federal agency for national service and volunteerism in the U.S. It provides an opportunity for members to serve their communities. Green Iowa AmeriCorps is a branch of AmeriCorps. It is a state-wide community service program that operates out of the University of Northern Iowa's Center for Energy and Education. Green Iowa AmeriCorps focuses on environmental stewardship, neighborhood revitalization projects, and energy efficient services.

Q: What projects did you work on as a Green Iowa AmeriCorps employee and what were your responsibilities with those projects?

A: During my summer internship program with Green Iowa AmeriCorps, I was a Land and Water Stewart. My responsibility during this period was to volunteer and engage in a variety of outreach and education events. During my 6-month and 11-month terms with Green Iowa AmeriCorps, I was the Energy and Community Outreach Coordinate. My responsibilities included creating social media posts, organizing outreach events, corresponding with community leaders, and helping the Energy and Community team. My main focus was to organize Outreach events for members to participate in, in the Cedar Valley Area. Some of the events we did included helping at Habitat for Humanity, trash clean-ups, water quality monitoring, prescribe burns and energy audits.

Q: Who is in your family?

A: My family consists of my mom, dad, and brother. My brother and his fiance have a son, my nephew, who will be turning 2 in January. My parents live in Hudson and my brother lives in Florida. I currently have one cat, a tuxedo, named Mizu or Miz for short.


Q: What do you like to do in your free time?



Sunday, December 7 - 2nd Sunday in Advent

Blue

At the heart of our Advent preparation stands John the Baptist, who calls us to repent and make a new beginning. As the darkness increases we turn toward the approaching light of Christ. For Christians he is the root of Jesse, the righteous judge who welcomes all, especially the poor and meek of the earth. We wait with hope for that day when the wolf will dwell with the lamb, and there will be no more hurt or destruction. From the Lord's table we are sent in the spirit of John the Baptist to proclaim that in Christ the kingdom of God has come near.

Stir up our hearts, Lord God, to prepare the way of your only Son. By his coming nurture our growth as people of repentance and peace; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

We wait with patience for the coming of the Lord, even as we rejoice at his presence among us this day: in word and holy supper, in church and in our homes, in silent reflection and in works of justice and love. We pray that God would open our eyes and ears to the wonders of Christ's advent among us.

Prayer of the Day

Stir up the wills of all who look to you, Lord God, and strengthen our faith in your coming, that, transformed by grace, we may walk in your way; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Today Isaiah prophesies that a young woman will bear a son and name him Emmanuel. The gospel is Matthew's account of the annunciation and birth of the one named Emmanuel, Godwith-us. During these final days of Advent we pray, "O come, O come, Emmanuel," a beloved hymn based on the O Antiphons, ancient prayers appointed for the seven days preceding Christmas. On this final Sunday of Advent we prepare to celebrate the birth of the one born to save us from the power of sin and death.

Prayer of the Day

Stir up your power, Lord Christ, and come. With your abundant grace and might, free us from the sin that hinders our faith, that eagerly we may receive your promises, for you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen

In winter's deepest night, we welcome the light of the Christ child. Isaiah declares that the light of the long-promised king will illumine the world and bring endless peace and justice. Paul reminds us that the grace of God through Jesus Christ brings salvation to all people. The angels declare that Jesus' birth is good and joyful news for everyone, including lowly shepherds. Filled with the light that shines in our lives, we go forth to share the light of Christ with the whole world.

Prayer of the Day

Almighty God, you made this holy night shine with the brightness of the true Light. Grant that here on earth we may walk in the light of Jesus' presence and in the last day wake to the brightness of his glory; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
