As the days grow shorter and darker (at least here in the northern hemisphere), we light candles each week to remind us that Christ enters a world of darkness, hatred, and pain—and brings light. As John's Gospel declares, "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it" (John 1:5.) What a powerful witness! This is our hope: that even amid the world's turmoil, the light of Christ continues to shine—revealing God's promise of a better world.

It's easy, I know, to wallow in the mud of despair and feel discouraged by all we see—division, conflict, injustice, suffering. Yet Advent reminds us: there is hope.

God's promise still stands. In the third week of Advent, we hear Mary's song—the Magnificat—celebrating how God scatters the proud, brings down the powerful, lifts the lowly, and fills the hungry with good things (Luke 1:51–53.)
