Pastor's Note: "The Heart That Grew Three Sizes"

This year, our Advent worship series will revolve around the story of *THE GRINCH* based on the writings of Matt Rawle in his book entitled "The Heart That Grew Three Sizes: Finding Faith in the Story of *THE GRINCH."*Each generation has likely heard the story of *THE GRINCH* through Doctor Seuss's *How The Grinch Stole Christmas!* with some adaptations being made throughout the years. Whether you have come to know the story through the



original children's book that debuted in 1957, or the animated TV special that came out in 1966, or the more recent blockbuster movie that graced the big screen in 2000, or even the musical theater production that began in 2007; "How the Grinch Stole Christmas! has remained an iconic story for several generations because of its seasonal theme, happy ending, universal ambiguity, and moral conclusion. The ambiguity throughout the story perpetuates an exciting mystery to the motivation behind both the Grinch's hatred of Christmas and his seemingly sudden transformation. We aren't quite sure why the Grinch is so miserable in the original story, which allows the readers to identify their own frustrations in the Grinch's character. Sometimes we are melancholy during the Christmas season and it's difficult to understand precisely why. Whether we appreciate it or not, it's easy to identify with the Grinch's aggravation. Likewise, at the end of the story we aren't given a reason why the Grinch's heart grew three sizes. The Whos do not seek retribution or vengeance; rather they invite the Grinch to eat with them at the table."(1)

Can we find Christ in the midst of a classical secular story? Scripture says that all things were made through Christ (John 1:3), and through Christ all things were reconciled to God (Colossians 1:20). "In other words, everything and everyone in our world contains a spark of the divine–everything is sacred, and whether or not we choose to live in that truth depends on our perspective. So now that all is sacred and in everything we are to see and proclaim his glory. I truly believe we are called not to reject the culture we live in, but to re-narrate its meaning–to tell God's story in the midst of it. As we walk with Christ we discover the divine all around us, and in turn, the world invites us into a deeper picture of its Creator. Through this lens of God's redemption story, we are invited to look at culture in a new and inviting way. We are invited to dive into the realms of literature, art, and entertainment to explore and discover how God is working in and through us and in the world around us to tell God's great story of redemption and transformation."(1)

I hope that you will join us this Advent season! We have lots of fun things happening in the month of December, so be sure to mark your calendar for the special joint services with opportunities for fellowship and fun! Bring your family, bring your friends, bring your neighbors! We will save you a seat!
