The Power of "Yes"

Advent is a season of waiting and expectation. We're waiting for the incarnation - the birth - of Jesus, while also waiting for Christ's return at the end of time. That's a lot to hold together! But we know that this story means a lot for us and for this world. It's a story of new beginnings. A story of hope and freedom. A story of God's action in this world.

Are you ready?

As we think about the biblical stories that shape our waiting and expectation, we recall many biblical figures who said "yes" to God, to be a part of God's story. Throughout the weeks of Advent here, we will be hearing some of those stories, especially the ones that bring us to the birth of Jesus. There were big yeses and little yeses. There were also lots of reasons NOT to say yes. I hope you will join us in worship as we hear these yes stories!

These stories are important because we also have lots of opportunities to say yes in our daily lives, and lots of reasons NOT to say yes. This world around us feels so unsettled and scary right now. Even the small yeses in our daily lives feel riskier somehow. Decisions about where we put our money, our time, our energy, our confidence, and our faith feel more important than ever during these volatile times. But we will be reminded that we come from a history of people who said yes.

What does it take for us to get to yes? Why does it matter? Why does it matter that we believe this? This is a story that we tell, that isn't just on a page or in ancient tales, but one that lives in our bones and calls to us to say our own yes when we are called into what God is doing now.



If you can't tell, "The Power of Yes" will be our theme for our Advent and Christmas seasons. We're going to hear the word "yes" a lot! And we will have lots of resources to help you with your yeses.

At church we have available two fun activities: There is a scratch-off Advent Kindness Countdown, where you can scratch off a circle a day throughout Advent and be encouraged to say yes to a way to share Jesus' light and love. There is also an Advent Paper Chain activity, offering a reflection question each day in December that will gradually build a colorful paper chain for your home. Be sure to pick these up when you're at church!

Then, in addition to the Advent devotional booklet that members of St. Paul's contribute to each year (which anyone can pick up for themselves), there is a devotional booklet available that supports our theme: The Power of Yes. We will have a few printed copies available at the church, but I encourage you to download a full-color version that we will post on the church's website.

I pray that you can have a meaningful encounter with these powerful yeses this season, and that there's a small voice within you that can also join the chorus of yes as we continue this practice of waiting.

BENEVOLENCE OFFERING



Your generosity is incredible! Every year, St. Paul's faithfully gives

away the offering collected on Easter and Christmas Eve. along with other special services throughout the year. This year those benevolence offerings were given to Hope5one. Hope5one is an organization in Warsaw that began in 2020 to fight against human trafficking. Their ministry works to provide safety and services for those who have been rescued from human trafficking, as well as providing education to the community to understand signs of trafficking and to know more about it. They are also working on building a Hope House, an eight-bedroom house that will provide safety and a new forward trafficking path for Executive survivors. Director. Connie McCray joined us after worship on October 12th to share presentation about human trafficking. A recording of that presentation is available on the church's Facebook page. Another part of our benevolence goes to support the mission of

Note A: As of October 31, 2025 83.33% of the year has elapsed, however, offerings as a percent of budget are only 71.3%. This indicated that offerings are approximately \$19,600 short of budgeted amounts.

Note B: Includes \$253,802.85 in roof replacement expenses and \$12,800 for parsonage window replacement (both of which were paid from insurance proceeds) and \$82,162.58 in property acquisition costs. Additionally, property/liability insurance premiums of \$44,789.90 were paid which is an increase of \$24,000 from 2024.

Note C: Includes \$2,468.96 of Communities of Calling Funds.

Note D: Includes restricted amounts of \$15,000 for Little Blessings and \$1,096.89 for Sunday School.

Note E: Includes \$101,208.86 in grant funds.
