#### A breath of new air!

The advent of our God shall be our theme for prayer; Come, let us meet him on the road and a place for him prepare (The Advent of Our God – LBW#22 verse 1)

Advent is the time of the church year when we prepare for Christmas and the birth of the Christ child. What does it mean to prepare for the birth of a child? While there is much to be done and the excitement grows as the due date gets closer, the excitement for a second or third child is often not as high as the first child, in part because there are not as many unknowns. That does not mean we love those children any less. It's just that the "newness," or the first time novelty, is not there with subsequent children.

For many of us, Advent can seem that way after going through it year after year. Maybe we just want to get to the good stuff of Christmas – enough with the preparing, let's just bring it on. Every once in a while, I have even heard someone say, "Can't we just skip Advent this year?" Sorry, but the answer is, "No, we cannot." Because, just like having a child is much more than getting all the physical things and paper work ready, one needs to think about and prepare mentally for how that little bundle of joy will change their life forever. It is another person you have to think about and plan for as part of your family. The nine month waiting period involves preparing physically, emotionally and spiritually for that new baby. Advent is a four week period very similar to those nine months. More than just a time to get the house ready and the gifts wrapped, it is a time to examine our inner thoughts and attitudes and take stock of exactly where we are in our spiritual life.

A few years back, I came across someone who broke down the word Advent in a way that I had not thought about before.

AD – God put ads out about his upcoming new product. The ads were very good. They captured people's attention and created anticipation.

VENT – A device used to bring fresh air into our home or office for our comfort.

So...

AD – God has a new product – His own Son! Revolutionary!

VENT – This 'product' will bring comfort and relief to people who often work and live in difficult and oppressive social climates.

I did a double take the first time I saw this, but then I came to like this line of thinking. Over time, it has stirred up in me a new wonder and desire to prepare during these four weeks for the birth of Christ at Christmas. You see, when we truly welcome the Christ child into our lives, it means that things are going to take on a different meaning for us. We know that Christ was born over two thousand years ago, and we celebrate that birth each year. However, Christ is born anew in us each year. As we hear the old, old story of his birth, all the hope and meaning that the world was given then is given to us again as well.

Advent is our time to prepare to receive anew the Christ child in our lives. The same child, Jesus the Christ, who will grow up and lead us to Easter and His most precious gift to us. It is at Easter at the foot of the cross that we clearly see the real reason for His coming as a child in a manger. To follow Him means that we can never be sure exactly what we will be asked to do in His name. New and wonderful, challenging, and yet exciting things will happen to us because of this Christ child. God has been advertising his Son to us for a long time.

His Son brings "fresh air" and a new outlook on life to us. It's time for us to get excited again, to gather in anticipation of having Christ alive in our world – not just in the past, but right now and right here. The birth of a baby is wonderful news and a joyous occasion to celebrate, but Christ's birth goes way beyond that. Join us this Advent season as we prepare for the most joyous birth– God's gift to us all!


# **HAAM's Holiday Gift Cards**
