# Nov. 30th Week 1: Despair for Hope | Psalm 121:1-8

# Dec. 7th Week 2: Anxiety for Peace | John 14:27

In the midst of troubling times, Jesus holds out the gift of peace. The peace Jesus gives is one that we cannot find in other things in this world.

# Dec. 14th Week 3: Sorrow for Joy | Psalm 30

When we experience sorrow, we can turn to God, trusting that joy will come again as a freely given gift.

### Dec. 21st Week 4: Fear for Love | 1 John 4:7-19

Fear can lead us into hating the people that God created. But fear loses its power when we receive the gift of love. We are made complete in love.

# Christmas Eve: Darkness for Light | Isaiah 9:2-7

Christ gives us the gift of light in the darkest moments of our lives. His light will guide and lead us into abundant life.

# Dec. 28th Week 5: Meaninglessness for Purpose | Jeremiah 29:11

Through our lives, we sometimes feel lost, not knowing who we are and where we are heading. God finds us in these places and gives us the gift of purpose for our lives.

# CHURCH COUNCIL FIRST UNITED METHODIST CHURCH November 11, 2025

The Church Council of First United Methodist Church of Clyde met in regular session Tuesday, November 11, 2025, Chairman Roger Miller presiding. Others in attendance were Barb Davis, Dennis Gable, Carolyn Gray, Jim Greenslade, Nancy Greenslade, Kathy Mathews, Pat Merritt, Debbie Overmyer, Linda Robinson, Lenora Stiger, and Madelynn Strayer.

Roger Miller called the meeting to order and opened with prayer.

Motion was made by Lenora Stiger and seconded by Barb Davis to approve the minutes of the meeting of September 8, 2025. Motion carried.

Treasurer's report: Linda Robinson reported a positive balance of \$498.20 in the Operating Fund at the end of October. Transfers to the Operating Fund have totaled \$18,431 through the end of October. East Ohio Conference has provided funds to cover Pastor Kim's costs while she is supplying coverage for Clyde and Green Springs.

Finance: Madelynn Strayer reported the 2026 budget was approved by Finance. It totals \$161,973.06. The 2025 budget was \$\$177,362.06. Madelynn further noted the committee will begin a fundraising campaign to raise \$20,000.00 to cover the cost of resealing the parking lot. One hundred squares will be offered at \$200 per square.

Christian Education: No report.

Congregational Care: Barb Davis noted the committee did not meet. The Halloween chili supper had approximately 50 in attendance. Candy was passed out to over 200 children during trick or treat. The next meeting will be December 10<sup>th</sup>. Christmas cards will be sent out. The 3<sup>rd</sup> annual soup cook-off will be held February 1, 2026.

Sisters: Barb Davis reported Sisters will have a table at the craft show, selling items made by some of the Sisters as well as cheeseballs made by the group. A Valentine's dinner will be hosted by Sisters on Saturday, February 14, 2026.

History and Records: Carolyn Gray had nothing to report.

Lay Leader and Lay Delegate: Lenora Stiger had nothing to report.

Lay Leadership: No report.

Membership: No report.

Missions: Debbie Overmyer noted the School of Hope day is lined up. The committee will decide the future of where community meals will be held.

Trustees: Jim Greenslade stated the third sink was installed. The majority of the cost was covered by donation. He noted the rent on both rental houses will be increased \$25 per month. Two quotes were received for the parking lot repair (Swartz \$22,000 and Hohenstein \$20,460). Hohenstein will be hired. The well/cistern was filled in. The chair lift passed inspection. The men's group did a leaf clean-up. They will also have a table at the craft show. The snow removal contract

was awarded to the same company that has done it the past few years. The Trustees are looking for a cleaning company to perform some tasks that Roger and Bob don't have time to do (nor should they be expected to do) in their volunteer capacity.

Staff Parish Relations Committee: Dennis Gable reported the committee met with District Superintendent Kelly Brown on September 8<sup>th</sup>. Rev. Kimberly Orr will fill in on Sunday mornings until Pastor Amy returns on November 24<sup>th</sup>. Charge Conference was held in Norwalk on November 8<sup>th</sup>. The DS will be looking for a pastor to serve the Clyde Church 50% and Green Springs Church 25%.

Worship: Kathy Mathews noted the harvest offering will be November 23<sup>rd</sup>. Ann Berenbaum will help arrange the items on the altar, and Sandy Anderson will take the items to the food pantry after worship. Treble Choir has begun rehearsals. A new decorating team was formed. It consists of seven people. The sanctuary will be decorated after worship on November 23<sup>rd</sup> and undecorated on January 4, 2026. All help is welcome. Poinsettias will be ordered. If people don't want poinsettias, they may make a monetary donation to the Blessing Box in memory or in honor of loved ones. Kathy will be resigning as chairperson at the end of the year. Sue Chidley has volunteered to take her place. A gift (\$100 Visa gift card) will be presented to Rev. Orr on November 23<sup>rd</sup>, and the altar flowers will be given in her honor.

Website update: Carolyn Gray reported that the new website hosted by tithe.ly is doing fine. The online giving part is not so fine. Carolyn will be working to get these problems resolved.

Youth: No report.

Delegate-at-large: Pat Merritt had nothing to report.
