#### From Pastor Lara:

Five weeks ago in worship, we began a series of readings from the biblical prophets. Each of them approaches the exile of the Judeans to Babylon from a different physical location and date on that timeline. They implored the Judeans to turn back to God, warning of the consequences if they didn't. And once the exile began, they assured the Judeans that God still loved them and hadn't abandoned them. That their future wouldn't be defined by their present circumstances, but by God.

Through the prophets, God gave the people **hope**.

We continue with the prophets and the theme of **hope** into Advent. The readings for the first two Sundays, while familiar, aren't ones that are typically heard in this season. The story of the fiery furnace in Daniel last week, and the story of the dry bones in Ezekiel (coming up this week), don't seem to be relevant to our preparation for Jesus' birth. But they remind us that **hope** isn't an idealistic notion. It enters with us into the reality of a situation, no matter how scary or brutal it is, and stays with us as it moves us forward. **Hope** reminds us that even though the exile had long ended by the time of Jesus' birth, prophets like John the Baptist and Mary, the mother of Jesus, (our readings for weeks 3 and 4) still clung to it as they waited for the Messiah.

**Hope**, ultimately, is what we hold onto during Advent. On the Advent wreath, it's the candle we light first. It's the candle that burns the longest. **Hope** is our posture in this season – we anticipate, we lean forward, actively make preparations, and trust what is to come.

As we embody this posture, we discover that preparing for Jesus' birth goes beyond the comfort of familiar music, traditional foods and customs, and being with our loved ones. We are reminded that the **hope** we have in Jesus is never in vain because it pulls us to a future that we trust is defined by God.










#### **November Contributions and Goal Achievement**

Contributions from all sources in November amounted to \$99,813, which represents 133% of the established goal of \$75,000. This impressive achievement was made possible by the generosity of our community, and we extend a heartfelt thank you to everyone who contributed.


#### **December Fundraising Goal Adjustment**

Since the November goal was significantly exceeded, the fundraising target for December has been adjusted downward. The original goal of \$148,366 has been reduced to \$123,554. A new progress thermometer for December will be displayed next week to help us track our advancement toward this revised goal.



#### Financial Outlook for the Remainder of 2025

The generous contributions in November have had a positive impact on our financial outlook. The deficit decreased from \$73,776 in October to \$45,297, as illustrated in the accompanying graphic. To meet our budget objectives and fully eliminate this deficit, it is essential for the Saint Andrew's congregation to raise \$123,554 during December. Reaching this goal is achievable with the ongoing support and generosity of our church community. For context, in December 2024, the congregation received \$138,758 from all sources.





## ELCC (Eastside Lutheran Church Community) churches, the Synod and the ELCA:
