#### Hello from Cyndy Decker and Holy Trinity's LSS Food Pantry Team

As you know, Holy Trinity has been sending a team of 8-10 members twice a month to the LSS Food Pantry on Champion and Frebis Aves. Most months we serve 150 to 180 people during the 3-4 hours that we are there. This past month with the government shut-down, we served 223 on the first Thursday (50 above our normal count). The patrons were very appreciative!

In November, we also had the honor of handing out the Thankfull Bags that the Lutheran Churches in Franklin County collected. Holy Trinity alone gathered 150 bags together. Every bit helps and I wish you could have seen the joy on people's faces as they were given not only a Thankfull Bag but a Turkey, Bread and lots of Produce from the Mid-Ohio Food Collective.

Most of us have never known the anguish of going to bed hungry. Or the shame felt by parents who can't provide a holiday meal for their children. God bless all of you who were inspired to generously give to those neighbors less fortunate. May your holiday spirit continue throughout the year! -The LSS Food Pantry Team

#### **Council Meeting Recap – November 2025**

Following is a brief recap of the November 2025 Church Council meeting:

- November's Leadership Discussion: Congregational Safety Plan
  - o Main Doors remain locked unless reception office is staffed
  - Other doors remain locked at all times
  - o Staff remain vigilant about being aware of who is in the building and reporting as needed
  - o Church and preschool staff participated in a consultation with UA Police
  - o UA police commended us for being proactive with our safety plan
  - o Remote access is currently available on CDP door, will soon be installed on front main door
  - o Recommended to consider training 8 people to serve as a Community Response Team
- Approval of Consent Agenda including staff and financial reports.
- Ministry Team Updates:
  - Laura Hudson discussed facility use as a ministry. The vision was to have space large enough for activities that don't necessarily involve worship while still building faith and community. Holy Trinity's facility is used for church-sponsored events such as meals, funerals, receptions, youth activities and the Child Development Programs. It is also utilized by Holy Trinity members for private events and community groups for weekly, monthly or annual gatherings. Holy Trinity views this as part of our outreach to the community. Non-member groups do not pay a set fee to use the space but are encouraged to make a donation as they are able.
  - O Dan Perry reported on annual gains for Mission Endowment Fund, half of which are used to pay off the loan for the organ. The remaining proceeds are distributed as grants to the community, Southern Ohio Synod or ELCA missions, and Holy Trinity ministry activities. The congregation will have the opportunity to approve the recommendations at the annual meeting in January 2026.

#### • Council also discussed:

- o The new Breeze database and online directory which will be introduced to the congregation as part of the congregational meeting on Sunday, December 14.
- o Council Nominations for the 2026 term (nominees to be announced soon).
- Reviewed HopeWood Pines list of projects/needs and associated costs. Council voted to contribute \$10,000 with the understanding HopeWood would apply it where it's most needed. Holy Trinity's contribution will come from our recently received Employee Retention Tax Credit (ERTC).
- O Pastor Steve asked Council's thoughts re: creating an emergency assistance fund. Discussed wanting to support those in need while noting this is not a long-term solution. Should we consider creating a group that would establish guidelines for the distribution of such funds? There was also discussion about groups Holy Trinity supports that are better equipped to help those in need.
- o Based on staff recommendations, a motion was approved to conduct Christmas Eve worship services at 4:00 and 8:00 pm this year. The 11:00 service has not been well-attended since the pandemic with less than 10 people in attendance in recent years and only 4 last year.
- o Initial review of 2026 Ministry Spending Plan draft. Staff will be in touch with ministry leaders in the coming month re: budget considerations for next year.

#### **Advent Devotions**

Advent has begun and everyone is invited for a special time of preparation. Advent devotional booklets are available for at-home study individually or with your family. The devotion includes a river stone that you will use along with the weekly meditations. You are invited to take home a set of materials if you haven't already done so. May this time of Advent be blessed for all!

Yusuf Azeem is Not a Hero, Wandering in Strange Lands and The Odyssey of Phillis Wheatley are books of note for this month. This literature intends to expand our awareness, theology and/or acceptance of diverse viewpoints. We in Neighbor-to-Neighbor hope you'll discover how these writings from various generations embrace what it means to be human and to walk in spirit. ...

#### Yusuf Azeem is Not a Hero by Faruqi, Saadia

Yusuf is excited to start middle school in his small Texas town, but with the twentieth anniversary of the September 11 attacks, it feels like the country's same anger and grief is all focused on his Muslim community. -- For grades 4-7.

## Wandering in Strange Lands by Jerkins, Morgan

While the great migration of African Americans from south to north in the early/mid 20<sup>th</sup> century provided black people with new economic opportunities, it also disconnected them from their roots, their land, and their sense of identity. In this deeply personal exploration, the writer recreates her ancestors' journeys across America, following the migratory routes they took from Georgia and South Carolina to Louisiana, Oklahoma, and California.

## The Odyssey of Phillis Wheatley by Waldstreicher, David

Admired by George Washington, ridiculed by Thomas Jefferson, published in London, and read far and wide, Phillis Wheatley led one of the most extraordinary American lives. Seized in West Africa and forced into slavery as a child, she was sold to a merchant family in Boston, where she became a noted poet at a young age. Mastering the Bible, Greek, and Latin, she composed elegies before and after her emancipation, for local elites, celebrated political events, praised warriors, and used her verse to variously lampoon, question, and assert the injustice of her enslaved condition.
