

Church Council Minutes November 16, 2025

Called to order in the Parish Hall by President Don Hill at 11:00.

Opening prayer by Pastor Rick Carter.

Treasurer's Reports

The Consolidated Fund Activity Report shows that we ended the month of October with a current operating fund balance of \$75,234.42.

In lieu of the regular agenda, Council representatives submitted written reports for individual committees:

Stewardship and Finance (Council Representative: Don Hill)

Council reviewed and approved the proposed 2026 budget at the October Council meeting. The overall budget is \$234,126.10, which is a three percent (3%) increase from 2025. A detailed breakdown and comparison to 2025 was mailed out to all voting member households in advance of the 23 November meeting.

Cemetery (Council Representative: Christy Brasington)

The Youth replaced American flags in honor and remembrance of Veterans Day.

Christian Education (Council Representative: Beth Bedenbaugh)

2. No Sunday School on Dec 14 (cantata) and Dec 28 (Sunday after Christmas/many may be traveling)

Property (Council Representative: Lacy Derrick)

- 1. Repair the caulking for the stained glass by entrance and back wall in Parish Hall. The transom window work is complete and they were able to use the existing protective glass. Shenandoah provided a change order on Jesus in the Garden to repair rotten wood. The window has been removed and taken to their shop to be repaired. Cost to repair, \$2,210.00 was approved by council prior to removing.
- 2. Drainage of church gutter lines Alex Metts suggested that Ron call Alan Overton who has a commercial clean up business. He may have a Jetter System that will unclog the drains so a camera can then be used to find the damaged drain. More to follow.
- 3. AED Unit has been installed in the Narthex.
- 4. Whitakers Floor Covering gave us 3 spare tiles that appeared to match the Church basement flooring. However, when placing the tile on the floor, the new tile was too light. In fact, the broken tile that was taken to Whitakers is lighter than the floor. In an effort to repair, Ron cut the broken floor tiles

to make one tile, which is an improvement.

Outreach and Evangelism (Council Representative: Gale Smith)

No visitation visits were made.

The new AED was hung in the Narthex. Thanks to the property committee. We discussed training for the Life Vac. There is a short video on their website. There is also a laminated copy of the instructions with the Life Vac which is located in the Church kitchen.

Movie night was held on Friday, November 14th with 3 youth and 4 adults attending.

We will discuss usher training the first of next year.

There are 7 people who have signed up for Game Nights. We plan to get them together the first of the year. The plan is for them to manage this themselves in the way that they want to meet.

Judy Derrick confirmed that the plans for the Advent Brunch have been finalized with the caterer and it has been paid for. Gale agreed to handle setting up on December 13 (Saturday) before. Will need some help with tables and chairs. WELCA to help with table cloths and decorations.

While some changes are being made in the Narthex, a board will be hung in the Narthex for sign-up sheets. The property committee agrees with our idea of where it should be.

Beth Ervin spoke to someone with The Department of Aging about speaking to our congregation concerning topics that would be relevant. More to come.

We talked about having refreshment outside after church. Discussed maybe once a month. There will be a sign-up sheet soon. Ongoing.

Children's and Youth Ministry (Council Representative: Don Hill)

Sunday, November 9th - the youth and their families helped to replace the American flags for the veterans in the church cemetery.

Thursday, November 20th - Beth Bedenbaugh and Elizabeth Hill will attend a workshop hosted by the SC ELCA called "Child & Youth Protection Workshop". Our goal is to continue to keep our children and youth safe at all church events. St Thomas does have a policy that is available for all members to read in our yearbook (pp 42-45). We need to review and update this policy.

Worship and Music (Council Representative: Fred Falls)

Call Process

Members of Council (both current and newly elected) met with Pastor Rick Carter (SC Synod, ELCA) to discuss the ELCA Call Process.

Call Process involves 3 phases: 1) Supply Pastors, 2) Interim Pastor, and 3) Interim Pastor/Call Committee; hi-lights of each phase include the following:

- 1. Supply Pastors St Thomas Lutheran Church will be responsible for identifying pastors and seminarians to lead services between now (16 Nov) and early/mid-January 2026.
- 2. Interim Pastor St Thomas Church Council will work with the SC Synod to identify an Interim Pastor. This pastor will be appointed by the SC Synod Bishop after consultation and approval by St Thomas Council. The purpose of the Interim Pastor is to provide stability during the absence of a regular pastor and to guide Council and the Call Committee in the Call Process; due to St Thomas' location in the Midlands of SC (good thing!), should expect to have an Interim Pastor in place around mid-January 2026. Interim Pastor will be paid for half time (~20 hours/week).

Interim Pastor/Call Committee – St Thomas Council will elect six (6) voting members of the congregation to serve on a Call Committee; expect to stand-up committee around February/March 2026; first priority of Call Committee will be to produce (with Interim Pastor's guidance), a Ministry Site Profile (MSP) for St Thomas Lutheran Church. Purpose of MSP is to define who we are as a congregation – vision/beliefs/priorities/ preferences/strengths/weaknesses; this information will be used to match St Thomas to a compatible pastor; expect MSP to completed in late April/early May 2026, at which point the formal Call Process will begin.

Bottom Line: Process will take time – please be patient!! (better to take longer than we would like, than to rush the selection and regret it)

At the 23 November Congregational meeting the 2026 church budget was approved by a vote of 41 – 9 (50 voting members in attendance); seven (7) members were approved by acclamation for Council. Four (4) will serve 2-year terms (Beth Ervin, Jeanne Lever, Debbie Rennhack, and Ricky Derrick); and three (3) existing council members will serve one (1) additional year during the transition to a new pastor (Christy Brasington, Don Hill, and Fred Falls).




