The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD

At Jesus' first sign in John's Gospel account—the changing of water to wine at Cana—Jesus' mother encouraged complete trust in His words ("Do whatever He tells you." John 2:5). Jesus' cleansing of the temple, which follows that sign, is met with less "trusting" reactions. His disciples accept and interpret His actions, but they do not understand them. Others demand a sign to lead them to belief.


Jesus strives to move them to belief through a subtle shift in terminology. He first justifies His actions as a cleansing of the temple (*hieron* in Greek), which has become a house of commerce (*oikos emporiou*). While the temple's activity is legitimate, Jesus implies that it is unseemly when He describes the place as His Father's house (*oikos tou patros mou*). When the Jews demand a sign, Jesus subtly shifts from talk of the temple (*hieron*) to the temple's sanctuary (*naos*), saying, "Destroy this temple (*naos*)". The response of the people shows that they misunderstand the distinction. This first use of "the Jews" begins the use of a term to identify those who do not believe Jesus and do not accept His messiahship. In the conclusion, the evangelist clarifies for the reader what Jesus meant, that He was referring to the temple (*naos*) of His Body.


Finally, it must be emphasized that the term "the Jews" does not represent the Jewish people, then or now. In fact, it does not accurately reflect Jesus' interactions with Jews in His time. Rather, the negative nuance of the term reflects the tensions between Johannine Christians and some Jews in the late first century.





HISTORICAL BACKGROUND:

THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA. YEAR C

The significance of the Basilica in the history of the Church can not be overstated.

- The Lateran Basilica, also known as the Archbasilica of Saint John Lateran, is the oldest and highest-ranking of the four major basilicas in Rome. Its history dates back to the fourth century when it was dedicated by Pope Sylvester I. This dedication marked a significant milestone in the development of the Christian faith and the establishment of the Church as an institution.
- The name "Lateran" comes from the Latin word, "Lateranus", which refers to the family that donated the land on which the Basilica was built.
