

Psalm 50

Discussion Questions

Opening

1. Welcome each person by name
2. Ask each person to briefly introduce themselves if they have not done so
3. Then invite each person to give one word (or two) to describe how they are feeling right now
4. Pray for the Holy Spirit to guide your discussion

Warm-up Question (optional)

Describe an experience you've had when you've been accused of something e.g., by a relative, a neighbor, lawyer, police officer, etc. Who was your accuser? What was the accusation? What was the outcome?

Reading

1. Invite one person to read through Psalm 50:1-4 slowly
2. Invite another person to read through Psalm 50:5-15 slowly
3. Invite another person to read through Psalm 50:16-23 slowly
4. Give the group 2 minutes to reflect silently on the Psalm 50
5. Invite the group together to read through all of Psalm 50 aloud (even if in different translations!)

Discussion: Feel free to select one or two or more questions

- What word or phrase do you notice from Psalm 50?
- What four titles are given to God in this Psalm? Why?
- Why does God accuse people who appear to obey him (with offer burnt sacrifices)?
- How does God describe the "wicked"? How could you rephrase this into today's language?
- How can you personally love a God who accuses you?
- How might the accusations in Psalm 50 apply to Restoration Fellowship?
- Think of someone you care for who doesn't believe the gospel or who has walked away from Jesus. What would you say if they asked you to help them understand Psalm 50:22 or 2 Thessalonians 1: 8-10?

Prayer: 15 minutes before the end of the meeting

- Invite people to share specific areas of praise or thanksgiving to the Lord
- Invite people to share particular prayer needs
- Invite people to pray openly

- Close with the Lord's Prayer together
