n November 23rd, the last Sunday of the Christian Year (Reign of Christ Sunday), seventeen people welcomed Rev. Dr. Karen Medland as our worship leader. We heard the lectionary scripture readings for this particular Sunday: Jeremiah 23:1-6 and Luke 23:33-43. Karen's message was entitled "Oh I Just Can't Wait to Be King" (attributed to Simba from The Lion



King). Karen told us briefly of her family's connection to Simba. The reading from the prophet Jeremiah talks how the people wanted a king like other nations. But the kings were not pastoral kings because they did not care for the people. However the king we welcome into our hearts and minds - Jesus - speaks of justice and love; welcomes children; seeks to heal; everyone gets to eat; and shows forgiveness and grace. We were left with the question "What can we give?" as God guides us to live in Jesus' example. So we pray, Our God, enable us to care for one another in the name of Christ the King.

The First Sunday of Advent was November 30th this year. As we enter this season of expectation fifteen people joined Julia this Sunday. The first candle of our Advent wreath was lit - the candle representing hope. Julia entitled her message "More Than Expected" and in the message we heard the scriptures: Micah 5:2; Isaiah 9:6-7; Isaiah 7:14; and Isaiah 53:5. We believe that Jesus is the one whom these prophets prophesied would come. Jesus was sent to show us how to live in the world in hope. Now hope is different from magical thinking. Hope is complicated. Hope is action. Hope is about change in the world. Jesus remains one of the greatest hope bringers to the world and turns that action over to us. We were asked to reflect upon "Our hope lies in our ability to change for the better and to bring about change in the world. What kind of change-maker are you?" What is our response? Following the message and reflection time, we shared our Advent communion meal and put the Crismons (symbols of Christ) on the tree.

A few reminders: if you bought tickets to the concert it is this Sunday, December 7th at 2 pm. Our candlelight service is Sunday, December 21st at 7 and there is no service in the morning that Sunday. There will be a baptism service at 9 on Sunday, December 28.


Admin Updates




