### Prayer - "Concerns to be left with the Burden Bearer"

We are beginning our Second week of Advent. While Advent is a season of **expectancy and anticipation**, it can also be a time of **busyness and anxiety**. At times such as these, we are encouraged by God to enter His Holy space. Prayer provides a gateway in...

As I reflect on this, I am reminded of a presentation on prayer, given some years ago by Corrie Ten Boom -a survivor of the Nazi concentration camps of WWII. In discussing one's prayer life, she was using props to illustrate her words. As Ms Ten Boom spoke, she carried heavy suitcases across the stage in front of her audience. Plastered all over the sides of each suitcase were prayer requests such as: "heal my sick mother," "bring peace to my life," or "help me to trust You more." While she unpacked the suitcases, she emphasized the point of laying concerns and burdens down before God in prayer. As she was finishing her point, she began to repack them and started carrying them around with her again.

As you can imagine, the bewildered audience must have wondered what it was all about! Ms. Ten Boom explained that many of us treat prayer like that. When we pray, we bring our concerns and petitions to God and He hears us. But, when we finish giving the requests to God we begin to worry about them all over again....as if we never let Him take charge of the concerns at all. How true is that!? I am sure that all of us pray –presenting ourselves and issues to God. But many if not all of us have from time to time, taken back the worry again about the issue or its outcome. By doing this, do we really trust God to do something about the request?

The burdens and concerns in our lives are real and often quite heavy. Do you remember the "Comfortable Words" in the Book of Common Prayer Service of Holy Communion? Jesus said this: "Come to Me all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." (Matthew 11:28 NIV).

Advent is busy and the busyness seems to crescendo as Christmas approaches. Perhaps we can ask God to examine our lives and ask Him to carry the heavy burden that weighs us down. Perhaps you have given to God once or twice before and need to leave with Him? What a difference it would make to our lives (and backs for that matter) if we left God's work to Him. In this busy season, we all could enter the rest that Jesus provides for our souls!
