By now most of us are probably used to seeing Christmas in stores well before Halloween. If you're a Costco shopper like I am, you might even have noticed a little yuletide advertising adorning the aisles before Labor Day! Many of my neighbors have had their Christmas lights up for a week or two. It's almost as if we are in a collective effort to stretch one month into three or four.

It's not like I'm complaining, though. When it comes to all the goings-on of the festive season we're now entering, my theme song is "Cold December Flies Away," (ELW 299, if you're interested). While everyone else is trying to stretch the season to three or four times is allotted length, my energies are directed at keeping it from being compressed into what seems like a week.

Maybe that's why the church paces itself with the rhythms of Advent. Our sanctuary—and many of your homes, I imagine—has an Advent wreath to mark the passing of time, week to week. Even secular time markers (when the tree goes up, when the baking starts, etc.) can serve to create moments to pause and remember again why this season is so special.

The one sentence from Matthew at the top of this article encapsulates not just the theme of Advent but of God's whole plan of salvation... and why we're encouraged not to lose focus *en route* to Christmas. Advent marks

the unfolding of God's saving plan born before the beginning of time—a plan involving both a birth and a death. Jesus' whole life was devoted to making God's life known to us and inviting us to share that life with him. In that sense, the Christmas story is still unfolding as we decorate our houses and remember why Jesus came that first Christmas.

I wish all of you a rich Advent and a Merry Christmas. My prayer for all of us is that we savor every day—every minute—of Advent and not let one single day 'fly away' this December but treasure each day as gifts not to be missed!




