As we enter the holiday season with Advent's light growing brighter each week, I want to pause and offer heartfelt gratitude for your faithfulness throughout this past year. Amid the candles, carols, and celebrations of Christ's coming, we are reminded that God has been present with us in every challenge and every joy.

We began 2025 with a budget offer a challenge. Trusting in the Spirit's guidance, we moved forward with confidence, yet we find ourselves nearing year's end still behind. In October, the Finance Committee made the difficult decision to use operating reserve funds to reduce the deficit, which fully depleted those reserves. As we navigate this together, your awareness, prayers, and support are deeply valued. And yet, even in a lean year, the Lord has been abundantly generous through you. Your service, stewardship, and compassion have allowed Messiah to shine Christ's light locally and globally.

- Installed new AC units for the sanctuary and A/V room
- Hired a new A/V technician
- Created a comprehensive church facility plan
- Remodeled the sanctuary sound booth

- Renovating 2145 S. Kings and preparing it for lease and securing market-value rent for 2135 S. Kings

Continuing progress toward mid-2026 "Upon This Rock" debt retirement with an estimated balance of \$195,000

### From the Desk of Council President

### A Call to Faithful Stewardship: Strengthening the Mission of Messiah

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. As we approach the final weeks of the year, weeks traditionally filled with reflection, gratitude, and anticipation we, are also called to a moment of deep honesty and spiritual responsibility as a church family. Messiah Lutheran Church stands today at a critical crossroads in its ministry. Our mission continues, our faith remains strong, but the reality before us demands that we come together in sacrificial stewardship for the sake of the Gospel.

As you will see in the financial summary included in The Spirit, we are operating at a significant loss this year. In order to help with the year-to-date deficit on the Profit and Loss Statement, money from an operating funds savings account was moved to the P&L statement. The money from the operating savings account (\$47,232.96) is shown on the P&L in The Spirit after the net loss (\$49,551) so the congregation can see that Messiah is operating at a significant loss. If pledges/contributions in November and December reduce the deficit, the money not needed from the savings account will be put back in restricted funds for future use.

This is not a mere accounting entry. It is a wake-up call. The savings account we pulled from was created to fund yearly ministry, it was created to preserve the future. Yet today, we are forced to use it just to meet basic expenses. If nothing changes, that reserve will eventually run dry, and the ministries we love— worship, children and youth programs, Bible studies, care ministry, outreach and missions—will face increasingly hard decisions. As of now, Messiah is running close to \$50,000 in deficit.

But this is not a message of despair this is a call to faith.

The early church faced these moments too. The Apostle Paul wrote to the Corinthians:

"Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." – 2 Corinthians 9:7

And just before that, Paul reminds us of the spiritual truth behind stewardship:

"Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously." – 2 Corinthians 9:6

The purpose of giving is not simply to pay bills or balance columns, it is to sow into the Kingdom. Every gift is a seed. Every dollar given to God returns as transformed lives, strengthened community, and a church that stands as a beacon of hope and truth in a world that so desperately needs Christ.

As Paul wrote to the Galatians:

"Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up." – Galatians 6:9

The future of this church will not be determined by what we have, but by what we do with what we have. And I believe deeply that God will provide through His people.

In these final months of the year, may we rise together in faith. Not reluctantly, not fearfully, but boldly, cheerfully, and united in Christ. Messiah Lutheran Church belongs to all of us, but even more importantly it belongs to Him.

May your heart be stirred toward generosity. May your spirit be moved toward commitment. And may the Lord bless the seeds we sow today 100-fold for the sake of His Kingdom.



### **Peppermint Almond Bark**

**Chocolate Layers** 

Topping

6 oz dark chocolate

10-12 crushed candy

canes

12 oz white chocolate

3 tsp. vegetable oil

**Directions** 

**Prepare Pan:** Line the bottom and sides of a 9" x 9" square baking pan with non-stick aluminum foil to prevent sticking and allow for easy removal.

**Melt Dark Chocolate Layer:** Melt the dark chocolate and 1 teaspoon of vegetable oil together in the same double boiler setup, stirring until smooth. Spread even layer in bottom of the pan.

**Melt White Chocolate:** Melt the white chocolate with 1 teaspoon vegetable oil using the double boiler method.

Pour the melted white chocolate over the dark chocolate layer and tilt the pan to create an even layer. Immediately sprinkle the remaining crushed candy canes evenly over the white chocolate while still warm and soft, pressing lightly to adhere.

**Final Freezing:** Place the pan back in the freezer for 20 minutes or until fully set.

**Serve:** Lift the peppermint bark out using the foil edges and break it into chunks. For clean squares, dip a knife or cookie cutter in hot water before cutting. Store in the refrigerator for up to two weeks.

## **Sanctuary Projectors**

We are currently in the process of replacing our projectors. They need to be replaced because they are 10 years old and approaching the end of their lifespan. One of the projectors has also started to shut off intermittently, which requires someone to go up on a lift to unplug and restart it. Another issue is that the current projectors are inadequate for serving the needs of the visually impaired members of our congregation. Purchasing new projectors would improve visibility for our visually impaired members.

New projectors would have an increase in contrast ratio and lumens. The contrast ratio is the difference between the brightest white and the darkest black a projector can produce. A higher contrast ratio translates to deeper blacks, richer colors, and a more vivid overall picture. Lumens measure a projector's brightness, with a higher lumen resulting in more brightness. Our current projectors have a contrast ratio of 500,000:1; the new projectors would have a contrast ratio of 3,000,000:1. The current projectors have 4,200 Lumens, and the new projectors have 11,000 Lumens. That is a 600% increase in contrast ratio and 260% increase in lumens.

We currently have \$20,000 raised to replace these projectors. We still need another \$20,000 in order to fully fund replacement projectors. It's important that these funds are obtained soon, so that the projectors can be replaced before one of them fails.

## **Christmas Crockpot Candy**

16 oz pkg roasted salted peanuts

16 oz package roasted unsalted peanuts

1 pkg chocolate almond bark

1 pkg white almond bark

1 4 oz baking chocolate bar broken into pieces Directions:

Pour salted and unsalted peanuts into the bottom of crockpot. Add half pkg of chocolate almond bark, whole pkg of white almond bark and the 4 oz of chocolate baking bar. Cook on low heat for 1.5 to 2 hours stirring the mixture with a wooden spoon at the 1 hr. mark.

Drop by the spoonful's onto parchment or wax paper. Let candy sit at room temperature about 1 to 2 hrs. Serve and enjoy.
