We find joy in connection, in laughter, in honest conversation, in acts of kindness.


Joy does not shy away from hard truths.


Today we light the candle of joy as a reminder that joy is real, even in struggle.

no matter where your path has led you in the past, today is a new day. So join me in declaring this good news:


We are known. We are forgiven! We are sent to serve. May we step forward in faith, always moving closer to God's call.



Christ is risen.


Christ will come again.


