

## PASTOR'S NOTE FROM PASTOR ERIK SPEAK A BLESSING

One of my favorite stories around the birth of Jesus that you will rarely hear on Christmas Eve, is one that takes place when Mary has just discovered she is pregnant and she goes to visit her relative Elizabeth in a town away from her own. The story is found in Luke chapter One:

39 At that time Mary got ready and hurried to a town in the hill country of Judea, 40 where she entered Zechariah's home and greeted Elizabeth. 41 When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. 42 In a loud voice she exclaimed: "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear! 43 But why am I so favored, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? 44 As soon as the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy. 45 Blessed is she who has believed that the Lord would fulfill his promises to her!"

Part of the reason that I love this encounter between Mary and Elizabeth is because of the way that Elizabeth speaks a word of blessing into the life of her younger relative. She does it not just once, but three different times: "Blessed are you among women...blessed is the child you will bear...and blessed is she who has believed.." Why so many times? Perhaps Elizabeth sensed that she needed to repeat this word of blessing multiple times to make sure that Mary would really hear it. Perhaps she knew that one of the reasons Mary was coming to her was because the younger woman was not doing well and really needed some help.

I can imagine that Mary was indeed anxious when she went to visit Elizabeth. This was her first pregnancy, and she would have been dealing with all the physiological issues that come along with that including things like morning sickness. She could have most certainly used some

physical support and advice from an older woman. Mary also would have been wrestling with the social stigma she was anticipating as she dealt with becoming pregnant before her marriage to Joseph. She would also have been struggling with what it would mean spiritually and emotionally as she thought about how to tell Joseph what was going on, and as she pondered what God had meant by choosing her to bear this child. I wonder if she actually felt that she was fortunate to be in the situation she was in, or rather had her doubts that being "chosen" was that good of a thing after all.

Yet in that moment when Mary may have been at her wit's end, her relative Elizabeth says she is blessed. Elizabeth speaks a word of affirmation into Mary. She gives a word of encouragement. She reminds Mary that despite how difficult things seemed, God is still with her and God is with this child growing inside her. By speaking this word of blessing, Elizabeth reminds Mary to hang on because she has a higher purpose. She is part of a divine story that will impact the lives of many and if she keeps on believing she will experience the reality of God's promises coming true.

Has anyone ever spoken a word of blessing into your life? Maybe that person didn't use a churchy word like "blessing", but did they give you a word of affirmation? Did they give you a word of encouragement? Did they remind you that you had a purpose when you may have been feeling at your wit's end?

Could we also speak a word of blessing into those around us? Perhaps the biggest gift you could give someone this Christmas is not another material thing they don't really need, but rather a word of affirmation and encouragement. How might you bless the store

clerk checking out your groceries or the retail sales person ringing up your purchase? How might you bless the server, housekeeper, or caregiver who helps you? How might you bless your spouse, child or friend with the words you use?

Just as Elizabeth was filled with the Spirit as she greeted Mary, you might be surprised how someone else is filled with a spirit of joy when you greet them with a word of blessing.

Often, the simplest actions and the presence of caring company speak volumes. That is the heart of our Communion Ministry.





#### PLEDGE DRIVE RESULTS

Our annual stewardship campaign and pledge drive took place this fall with a theme of **Grace in Action**. We focused our Sunday messages around this theme as well as a series of Temple Talks where our speakers shared personal stories and explored different ways of looking at how we give. This included thinking about giving as a percentage of our income, giving as a consistent dollar amount, and first fruits giving as a way of honoring God as first in our lives.

I am excited to share that members of Holy Trinity have taken the idea of stewardship to heart and received many responses in a timely manner before and on Commitment Sunday. We celebrated with a delicious meal and heard from some more folks about the impact the church has made in their lives. Many of the responses we received were in the form of pledges. To date we have heard from 101 people, for a total of over \$454,000 worth of pledges. There were others who also responded they would give but would not be committing to a certain pledge at this time.

We are very thankful for all of these generous intentions which are very helpful in guiding the council and in putting together a ministry plan and budget to fund it for 2026.
