

Making Disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world



Even in light of the announcement made in church (which I made because I felt a very strong pull from God to make and not because I was supposed to or had permission to), my ministry with First United Methodist Church of Deming and with each of

you is not over. There are several things that have been talked about. It is time to stop talking and get those things implemented.

First, we are bringing back homebound communion. There are several of our members who are unable to come to church mostly due to health reasons. Many of them are intimately connected to Jesus and want to remain connected to the church. As you can imagine, staying connected to the church is hard to do when you are not able to get to the building. *The United Methodist Book of Worship* says, "Since the earliest Christian times, communion has been brought as an extension of the congregation's worship to sick or homebound persons unable to attend congregational worship" (BOW, 51). Communion is one way to nurture the relationship with Jesus, accompany homebound members in worship, and provide a sliver of connection to the greater body of the church. There are a few cogs that need to be oiled in order to get this off the ground. The biggest one is that we need people who are willing to spend an hour or two of their time on the first Sunday of every month. You do not need to provide anything except your willing heart and your own transportation. If this is something you would be interested in, mark your calendars for **December 9th at 2:00 pm** for a short training session. The goal is to begin this ministry on January 4, 2026.

Second, we are in the process of getting a visitation team going. I know...I know. Visitation is my pastoral weakness. I need people to keep me accountable, so I am compelled to get out of my office to visit. However, with as many people as we have who would benefit from a visit, it is impossible to do by myself. We currently have a core group of four individuals who are working on getting the rough edges smoothed out and creating an organized, recognized group. I know there are several of you who visit church members on at least a semi-regular basis. We could always use more bodies in this group as we work to solidify its vision and purpose. This group has tremendous room to grow. I envision it (and I think at least one of the current members would agree) to quickly move from a visitation group to a congregational care ministry team. The next meeting for this group is on Wednesday, November 5" at 2:00 pm. Please come and see where you can help.

Finally, there will be a discipleship training opportunity in late January-early March 2026. I talked about this some in the September newsletter. I have titled it "Because Somebody Prayed." This title is somewhat a misnomer as this is not a prayer workshop. Prayer does have some significance to the overall project, but like I said, it is NOT a prayer workshop. For transparency's sake this is the final project for my Doctor of Ministry degree. However, it is not intended to be a 'one and done' project. It is a starting point. It is supposed to help people identify their ministerial passion and missional purpose in the church. In other words it is to help you identify your spiritual gifts and empower you to use them in serving the church and God's kingdom while I am here and for years after, because, folks, just because we retire from a job, doesn't mean we retire from church. There is no retirement in God's kingdom.

It should be noted that although the Because Somebody Prayed training has implications that would benefit everyone in the church, not everyone is a candidate for this training. As this is a scholastic endeavor, there is data involved and people outside the demographic would skew the results. That said, the target demographic is anyone who is over the age of sixty, retired, not currently involved in the ministries of the church, and struggling to identify their purpose in the church. I can't officially begin recruiting participants until January, but If this is you, let's talk!

It is my hope and prayer that everyone can find somewhere to fit in and serve in ministry. It doesn't have to be any of these. Anything you are passionate about can become a ministry. If there is something that you would like to do, let's figure out how to get it started. And let's commit to serving God and Christ's church together.






tients. This fund enables others needing support to find the help they so desperately are looking for.
