Making Disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world



I am currently sitting in a hotel room 1,400 miles away from home. I also have my second cold since the week of Christmas. There is nothing like being sick and away from home to make one realize how much home calls to a person. Home really is where the heart is, and right now my heart is so very far

away. Yes, it is with Carl and our dogs, but it is also with each one of you. Over the last two and a half years, you all have become home and family for Carl and me.

That said, I know that I am not doing all I can to express my heart to all of you. There is a good-sized section of our church family that I have not done enough to engage. That section is our home-bound members and those who do not come to Sunday worship for whatever reason. Visitation is not my forte. It never has been. It probably never will be. Yet that doesn't mean it doesn't need to happen.

Visitation is a huge part of church unity. It not only helps connect the family, but it also has a huge part in fostering the spiritual health of those people who are at a place where physical participation in the ministry of the church is difficult. Visitation, when done with an empathetic and caring heart, is imperative for helping people to realize that they are still precious, beautiful, and beloved children of God, not matter what. This, in itself, should be a cause for celebration because like it or not, the chances are very high that most of us will one day be in such a position.

In the letter to the church in Ephesus, the Apostle Paul writes, "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God— not the result of works, so that no one may boast" (Ephesians 2:8-9, NRSV). How comforting is it to know, especially as we all age and decline in ability, that there isn't a ticket to heaven that is based on what we can do. Our path to heaven has been paved solely by the grace of Jesus Christ. This is what we should be teaching. It is what we should take to heart. It is what we need to be reminding everyone about, especially those who don't have the physical connection to the church they once were capable of.

I know there was an article in last month's newsletter that was all about getting involved in the church. Yes, that is important. Everyone has a place, even those who think they are incapable of doing anything. Every person's gifts and graces are needed to make the church whole. However, it is not those gifts and graces – it is not our efforts – that make our salvation possible. Rather, it is that our physical efforts naturally flow out of our knowledge that we are already saved through the death and resurrection of our Lord and Savior. That is what Savior means in the first place, one who saves.

Unfortunately, many of us forget this lesson somewhere along the way. We get so wrapped up in being busy for God, that we forget that God loves us first. Eventually, we get so lost in the doing that we tie our worth to what we are doing instead of to Christ. I guess what I am trying to say is that the church needs you. She needs your work. She needs your time, talent, and treasures. She needs your presence. But in all this need, we need something too. We need to be reminded that we are much more valuable than our ability to contribute to the needs of the church. First and foremost, we are people, created by God, to be loved by God, and to love one another.

This reminder should be the impetus of visitation. Therefore, visitation should be a significant part of my job as your pastor. But as I said earlier, I am not so good at it. It is not that I don't like it. Once I get to the visiting part, it is one of the loveliest parts of ordained ministry. My biggest issue is putting aside all the unimportant tasks at the office and making that first phone call to set up the appointment. This is where I am asking for your support. I need you to hold me accountable for visiting our members. I need you to be accountable for visiting our members. It takes all of us to do this. So, we are starting a visitation team. We have a good core group of people to start with, but we can always use more. If this is something you think you are called to do, please consider joining us. We will have our organizational meeting on Wednesday, February 12th at noon. Let's all work together in this so all of us know that we are saved by grace just because we are loved.


