The Service of Lessons & Carols

The service of Lessons & Carols dates back to the mid-19th century. In its fullest form, it is a service of nine lessons or readings from Scripture followed by the singing of carols. We listen to the great stories of our spiritual tradition which remind us of Go'd great plan for humanity from our beginning to our end.

Today we will read only seven of these readings and give thanks to God for the stories of his love and healing for us.

This Sunday we listen to the stories up to the promised birth of Jesus. On the Sunday after Christmas, we will recall the entire Christmas story.

Children will gather after the opening songs for a commissioning and then return for communion. All of our staff and volunteers have had a criminal record check and have been approved for ministry with vulnerable people.


