



PRAYER STATIONS

A. When people are imprisoned or held captive, break the chains and offer release. Strengthen the work of the church in restorative justice, breaking cycles of poverty, and welcoming the immigrant. God of grace, **hear our prayer.**

A. As we await your coming, we give thanks for the faithful who have lived and died in faith, especially Mary, mother of Jesus and John of the Cross. May their boldness of faith inspire our witness and work. God of grace, **hear our prayer.**

P. Draw near to us, O God, as we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in your mercy through Jesus Christ, Emmanuel. **Amen.**




INVITATION TO COMMUNION






