CHRISTMAS CARDS FOR JOY

Our hearts are filled with joy and anticipation as we wait for the Lord to come and set us free. Trusting in the Lord, we can be freed from the death dealing structures of oppression and destruction around us. We trust that God is powerful enough to bring the powerful down from their thrones, lift up the lowly, and fill our hungry neighbors with good things. This joy can open our eyes and stir our hearts out of the complacency so that we might shine the light of Christ's joy to our neighbors and friends, and so that we are not satisfied with things as they are. Moreover, it moves us to participate in building God's kingdom here on earth.

Woodbury, with a population of 9,787 people, has a food insecurity rate of 11.5%. That about 1,126 people who can't always count on having enough food. Food insecurity occurs when a household cannot access enough food due to a lack of money and other essential resources. It is often linked to one or multiple factors that lead to food insecurity, creating a cycle that can be hard to break. These factors can be related to household income, expenses, access to affordable health care, the surrounding social and physical environment, and barriers to opportunity which play a role in preventing some households and communities from being food secure.

The quantity of households that experience food insecurity and do not qualify for SNAP further underscores the importance of charitable food assistance. In a recent Hunger in America study, our neighbors told us about the choices they face due to limited resources:

69% had to choose between food and utilities 67% had to choose between food and transportation 66% had to choose between food and medical care 57% had to choose between food and housing 31% had to choose between food and education


