

## White Gift Sunday

A splendid number of gifts were placed under the parish's Mitten Tree on Advent Two, Sunday December 7th. Following in the tradition of White Gift Sunday, the anonymous gifts were addressed to a boy or a girl ,in plain white paper. They, have been transported to the Fairview Salvation Army where the gifts will be distributed to boys and girls in need.

The gifts added to the exciting display of mitts, scarves, toques and socks which were already adorning our mitten tree. Donations to the Mitten tree will be collected on December 14<sup>th</sup> and taken to the Halifax West Ecumenical Food Bank for distribution.

## Food Insecurity in Clayton Park, Rockingham Birch Cove and Prince's Lodge

Almost 1 in 3 ( 30.3% ) Haligonians live in a household that experienced food insecurity in 2024. Last year the West End Ecumenical Food Bank helped 15,000 individuals . This year in the first 8 months of the year, the food bank has already assisted 12,000 people. Saint Peter's was one of the original churches that formed the West End Ecumenical Food Bank in 1993 and we have supported the food bank ever since. December 21<sup>st</sup> is Food Bank Sunday at Saint Peter's. Donations can be placed in the collection boxes in the narthex. Those able to make a financial donation to the food bank can write cheques to the 'Halifax West Ecumenical Food Bank', 33 Chartwell Lane, Halifax. B3M 3S7 . They can be mailed , dropped off at 50 Gesner Street on Tuesday mornings, inserted in an envelope and place in the collection plate or dropped through the mail slot on the church's main door.
