



Lead the Prayers of Intercession, Peace, and Welcome from the front center of the assembly. The ASSISTING MINISTER invites the assembly into prayer.

The prayers are prepared locally for each occasion. The following examples may be adapted or used as appropriate.

In our waiting and watching, we come to you in prayer, O God, trusting your promise to renew the church, the nations, and the whole creation.

A brief silence.

God of power and mercy, we praise you for Jesus and his acts of healing and liberation. Lead us to proclaim the good news from generation to generation, that all may place their hope in you. Give your bold spirit of servant leadership to all who guide the church, especially for our bishops, Yehiel and Jeff. *Sung Response:* Wait for the Lord, whose day is near. Wait for the Lord: be strong, take heart!

When lands are parched and dry, bring rain and snow; where wilderness is barren, sow seeds of life. Fill the lands with trees that grow, plants that flower, and creatures that thrive, as nature proclaims the wonder of your works. *Sung Response:* Wait for the Lord, whose day is near. Wait for the Lord: be strong, take heart!

When there is injustice or corruption among nations and leaders, root it out. Turn their attention to inequity and the cries of the poor. Instill a deeper sense of compassion and care in all who govern. Grant fear of the Lord to all in authority that they may govern with wisdom, especially our president, Donald, and our governor, Gavin.

Sung Response: Wait for the Lord, whose day is near. Wait for the Lord: be strong, take heart!

When bodies weaken and hearts grow fearful, speak your blessing. We pray especially for those whom we name before you...

Pause for 15 seconds to allow assembly to speak or type those names.

In uncertain times, remind us of the promise spoken to our ancestors in faith. *Sung Response:* Wait for the Lord, whose day is near. Wait for the Lord: be strong, take heart!

When people are imprisoned or held captive, break the chains and offer release. Strengthen the work of the church in restorative justice, breaking cycles of poverty, and welcoming the immigrant.

People of God, for what else do we pray or give thanks?

Pause for 15 seconds to allow assembly to speak or type those names. The person offering the prayer or the ASSISTING MINISTER may conclude each petition:

As we await your coming, we give thanks for the faithful who have lived and died in faith *especially for those whom we name before you...*

Pause for 15 seconds to allow assembly to speak or type those names.

Draw near to us, O God, as we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in your mercy through Jesus Christ, Emmanuel.


